

CHANLER WAVING MAY TURN TO BRIDE

"Husband Bob" Contemplating Break With Family for Cavalieri.

SONG BIRD COMING TO AMERICA SOON

Brother Oreste Recites Sister's Troubles Anew—Describes Quarrels In Paris.

NEW YORK, Sept. 15.—Impelled by what he terms a gentleman's honor, Robert Winthrop Chanler is reported to be wavering today, uncertain whether to break forever with his powerful family clan, the Astors and Chanlers, or to submit to their ultimatum, repudiate his pre-nuptial contract with Mme. Cavallieri and begin legal steps to save the great fortune which he signed over to the beautiful singer on the evening of their marriage in Paris.

With one brother, John Armstrong Chanler, or Chanler—as he prefers to call himself—already estranged, the indications today were that "Sheriff Bob" would defy the wishes of his family, and demand that his wealth be transferred to his bride without further delay.

Through the secretiveness and mystery with which mysteries have been conducted, various rumors have arisen as to the true state of existing affairs.

According to cable advices received today, Mme. Cavallieri has changed her mind and will sail for America earlier than she previously anticipated, and if she does this, lawyers in charge of the case predict that there will be something doing every minute after her arrival.

To Work With Brother.

The possibility of an international legal wrangle fought out in the courts of America was not resumed today by the news that Mme. Cavallieri would assist her brother, Oreste, and her husband, "Bob," in having the ante-marriage agreement carried out, or else in effecting a financial settlement with the family.

"Lina loves the American people because they have treated her so kindly and generously, and she is pained deeply at the light placed upon her conduct by the American press," said Oreste Cavallieri today in explaining why his sister may hurry to New York. "My sister never intended to dupe Mr. Chanler, and she has been made the victim of legal technicalities and the sensationalism of gossip."

"Mme. Chanler has the stubbornness of certain people interested in the Chanler fortune to thank for much of the notoriety which has attended this affair. She is deeply grieved. Lina loves America so well that she would likely reside here if their health would permit it."

Bread Thrown In Face.

"My sister made it plain to Mr. Chanler that she did not love him before they were married, but that she had a great deal of respect for him," said he. "While they were happy after their marriage, the usual little love quarrels naturally arose. In a fit of anger Mr. Chanler threw a piece of bread in my sister's face, and she retaliated by throwing a basket of cherries at him. He complained about it for many things, saying that his food was not cooked right, and that his apartments were not cleaned properly."

"Once when he unexpectedly arrived home and found Prince Murat calling upon my sister he grew awfully angry and burst out of the room, shouting: 'That's the limit; two princes.'"

"Naturally all these things made Madame nervous. When she saw that I myself took a shower bath with my clothes on, I was so worked up."

The hint that Chanler's family bitterly opposed his wooing of the beautiful Parisian diva became one of the day's developments when Sidney Harris, personal attorney for Chanler, made a statement containing that assertion.

Mrs. Aldrich Leads.

Mrs. Richard Aldrich, a sister of "Husband Bob," is accredited with leading the opposition in the Chanler family, and the persistence with which the family fought against Chanler's marriage has turned to equal insistence that Bob's share of the Chanler fortune be not turned over to his spouse.

According to a sensational utterance from Oreste Cavallieri, it was Chanler himself who suggested that he acknowledge the paternity of Mme. Cavallieri's sixteen-year-old son. However, Mme. Cavallieri opposed this for fear that it would complicate the disposition of Chanler's fortune in the event of his death before he obtained his majority.

A family counsel was planned for today, when a final effort would be made to reason with Robert Winthrop Chanler. The details of this meeting were guarded with such strictness that it was not known definitely whether it would be held in lawyers' offices in this city, or in Chanler's Dutchess county home.

UNIONISTS DEMAND PARLIAMENT RIGHTS

British Workmen Will Bring Pressure to Revoke Osborn Decision.

SHEPHERD, England, Sept. 15.—The voices of nearly 2,000,000 English laborers were raised today in a demand for the repeal of the Osborn decision, by which labor unions are forbidden to levy taxes for the support of their representatives in parliament.

The question was raised in the labor congress today, and by vote of 17,000 to 13,000, which included proxies, the decision was denounced, and all unionists throughout Great Britain were urged to bring every pressure to bear upon the government for the repeal of the law.

OFFICIALS TO GREET PRINCE TSAI HSUN

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Sept. 15.—All the official courtesies usually extended by the Government to visiting royalty will be accorded Prince Tsai Hsun, the head of the Chinese naval establish-

ment upon his arrival in San Francisco tomorrow.

The prince, who is a member of the imperial family of China, comes to inspect the naval and military establishments of the United States. Attended by a numerous suite, he will visit the academy at West Point and Annapolis, the Cavalry Training School at Fort Myer, the Naval War College at Newport, and several of the navy yards on the Atlantic coast.

PLANS FOR WINTER AT JUVENILE CLUB

Repaired and renovated, the rooms of the Washington Juvenile Club, at Seventh and L streets northwest, will be reopened about September 25, with many added features. Physical culture and gymnastic work will be a feature of this season's work, the gymnasium having been put in charge of R. C. Scott, physical director last year. Superintendent G. A. Fowler will have charge of the club rooms again this winter. He expects to establish a girls' department.

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The club's baseball team has won twenty-five out of twenty-nine games during the past summer, and it is expected that the football team will have an equally good record.
