KILL THE SQUIRRELS IS FARMERS' DEMAND

Crops in Maine Devastated by the "Pesky Things."

LEWISTON, Me., Nov. 6.—The State of Maine is overrun with gray squirrels, according to reports received at the office of the commissioners of inland fisheries and game.

Thousands of dollars' worth of damage has been done to the crops, and in some places whole cornfields have been completely destroyed.

Two years ago a State law was passed making it illegal to hunt and kill gray squirrels. As a result the squirrels have multiplied rapidly and have become tame and destructive.

BUILDING A LAKE FOR LITTLE GIRL

Former Representative Pierce to Spend \$30,000 for Skating Pond.

LEGMINSTER, Mass., Nov. 6.—That one little girl devoted to skating might have her heart's dearest wish, a real pond in her own yard, a Massachusetts millionaire, former Representative Harry L. Pierce, has just started on his vast estate here what promises to be the largest artificial lake in Massachusetts.

This toy lake when finished will be large enough to float a large section of the United States navy, and to the incentive of his small daughter's love of skating, the millionaire's decision to gratify her wish has been strengthened by his own boyhood love of building dams.

The lake is to be built by damming a brook. It is to cost \$30,000, and will involve the labor of a large body of workmen. It will easily outlive anything of its kind in Massachusetts.

DRIVER OF WATER CART FALLS OFF THE WAGON

Says He's So Tired of Seeing the Common Liquid He Is Driven to—"Drink Some Next Time," Answers Judge.

NEW YORK, Nov. 6.—For a while yesterday it seemed as if the gilding hand of Policeman E. Aloysius Kennedy had been withdrawn from the west side court and as if Magistrate Herrman would have to conduct the proceedings without the assistance of his unofficial conductor.

The cases of several minor offenders had been disposed of and there was every indication of a speedy clearance of the docket when the door opened and E. Aloysius Kennedy, in a wet raincoat and carrying a look of determination stalked in conveying a prisoner who was more than six feet tall and somewhat thin. The prisoner carried an umbrella.

"Some men are born crazy and some go crazy doing what this fellow did," said Policeman Kennedy. "He works for some of those automobile firms in Broadway, near Columbus circle. 

He came to the United States in 1884 and obtained a position in this city on the Amzger, and held his position until that paper suspended publication.
