The holders of the extended four per cent improvement bonds, Series A and B, of the Washington Gas Light Company, are hereby notified that the stockholders, at their special meeting held on the 14th day of October, 1910, authorized and directed the Board of Directors, if the same should meet with their approval, to issue \$5,000,000 of five per cent fifty-year General Mortgage Gold Bonds, dated November 1, 1910, and payable November 1, 1960, for certain purposes, and among others for the purpose of retiring its extended four per cent improvement bonds, Series A and B, and that in pursuance of said instructions of the stockholders, the Board of Directors of said Washington Gas Light Company in a meeting duly convened on the 24th day of November, 1910, passed the following resolution, to wit:

"RESOLVED, That the Washington Gas Light Company hereby offers to redeem on and after January 1, 1911, its two outstanding issues of 4 1/2% bonds, one of said issues being Series A and dated July 1, 1887, and the other of said issues being Series B and dated January 1, 1888, when presented for redemption in amounts of \$500, or multiples thereof, by an exchange of a like amount of the Company's fifty-year 5% General Mortgage Gold Bonds, dated November 1, 1910, which are issued only in denominations of \$500 each; the interest on said bonds respectively to be adjusted to the date of delivery for exchange; provided the holders of the said two issues of outstanding 4 1/2% bonds, Series A and B, present the same for exchange in the amounts or multiples aforesaid within thirty days from the first day of January, 1911.

"That notice of this Company's offer for redemption of its said outstanding 4 1/2% bonds by exchange for its fifty-year 5% General Mortgage Gold Bonds be given by publication of this resolution in at least two newspapers in general circulation in the City of Washington, D. C., once a week, for three successive weeks ending on January 1, 1911.

"That the books for the transfer of bonds be closed from December 20, 1910, to and including December 31, 1910, inclusive.






