

SANDY SPRING HIGH SCHOOL TO HOLD ITS EXERCISES TONIGHT

Montgomery County Institution Will Graduate Class of Six.

ROCKVILLE, Md., May 31.—The annual closing exercises of the Sandy Spring High School will take place this evening in Lyceum Hall at Sandy Spring. The graduates will be Misses Margaret Brooke and Helen Barnes and Messrs. Eric Hutton, George Dorsey, Stanley Wetherald, and Frederick Iddings, and the address to the class will be delivered by State Senator Blair Lee. Charles G. Myers is principal of the school.

Mayor Lee Offutt, of Rockville, who several weeks ago announced himself a candidate for the Democratic nomination for county commissioner from the Fourth collection district, has withdrawn from the contest, giving business matters as his reason for not remaining in the field. It is understood that Charles Veirs, who four years ago tried for the nomination but who was beaten by Commissioner R. H. Cissel, will take Mayor Offutt's place in the contest.

ANACOSTIA HOMES DRAPED WITH FLAGS

Residence Section Makes Pleasing Appearance for Memorial Day Celebration, and Ten Thousand People Participate in Exercises at Various Points.

C., MAY 31.—While Memorial Day observances in cemeteries and parks in this part of the District and its vicinity were general yesterday, and although there were probably 10,000 people who attended the various events, the day passed without any untoward incident.

In Anacostia, proper, a pleasing appearance was given to the residential section by the display on dwellings of large American banners.

Public ceremonies at St. Elizabeth's Asylum and Randle Highlands were attended by thousands of visitors. Forestville, Prince George county, Md., where races were held by the afternoon in the driving park by Dr. John E. Sansbury, attracted many of the sport-loving residents. Visitors to the cool park in Congress Heights were noted by the hundreds.

Capt. William T. Anderson, commanding the Eleventh precinct, was given a detail of policemen from the Fifth and Sixth precincts, in addition to those from his own station, to preserve order, but the situation at no time required their intervention, the day passing without any arrests being recorded.

After taking part in the military maneuvers in Randle Highlands yesterday afternoon, George Warnicke, seventeen years old, a member of the Boys' Brigade, was overcome by the heat just as the silver cup was being presented to the winning company by Col. A. E. Randle.

Warnicke was taken from the ranks and treated at the engine company's quarters. He was then removed to his home, 747 Tenth street southeast, by Policeman J. M. Horton in an automobile loaned by Colonel Randle. Fred Woodson, aged thirteen years, who lives at 1343 Potomac avenue southeast, another boy who took part in the maneuvers, was also overcome by the heat. He was given treatment and sent home.

Teams representing the single men and the married men of the Anacostia Methodist Episcopal Church congregation played two games of baseball on the Christie diamond yesterday evening before a large assembly of Anacostia people. The single men won both games in rather easy fashion, outfitting and outfielding their opponents. The score of the first game was 10 to 1, that of the second 13 to 7. In the first game the batteries were Russell Phipps and Phil Miller for the winning team, while William Coulter and George Simpson essayed like service for the losers.

The second game had for the batteries Martin and Russell Phipps and Howard Phipps and Phil Miller for the winners, and Edward Taylor and George Simpson and William Coulter and Rhom Tighman for the losers. The games marked four victories for the unmarried men, while the married men have won only one game.

The dedicatory service of Thursday evening next, which will mark the utilization of the large basement just completed for assembly purposes beneath the Anacostia Baptist Church, will be an interesting one. The program calls for a union prayer service and covenant meeting.

The participants will assemble in the upper church and will march singing to the basement, Pastor Frank L. Bardens, the deacons, the trustees, and the members of the church being in line in the order named. There will be a sermon by the Rev. Mr. Bardens and the deacons will speak.

Policemen who have been at work on the kidnaping of Oscar Potter, an eight-year-old inmate of the Episcopal Home for Children, in Anacostia, who was carried away by two men in a buggy a number of days ago, while he was attending school, have been unable to secure any definite information concerning the whereabouts of the child. Testimony has been presented to the grand jury in an effort to cause the indictment of Arthur Duguid, who alleges he is the father of the child, and who wrote to Minnie Potter, the boy's sister, to the effect that he has the missing lad in Norfolk, Va., and it is believed that the grand jury will return an indictment charging Duguid with abduction.

If this action results from the testimony that has been presented, steps will be taken to cause the authorities of other States to have Duguid arrested and returned to Washington. Information from Vanceville, N. C., the home of Duguid, is to the effect that he has not appeared there yet with the boy. The managers of the Episcopal Home are following the progress of the case with interest, as they are anxious to have Duguid apprehended.

William Watson, the young medical man, who is ill in Providence Hospital from typhoid fever, has shown no improvement, as other complications have set in.

Berlin Critics Hostile To Lillian Nordica

BERLIN, May 31.—Lillian Nordica, who in response to an invitation from Prince Henry of Prussia appeared at the Royal Opera House here, in the latest American star to feel the resentment which the American operatic invention has aroused in Berlin. The prima donna sang in "Tristan and Isolde" and had a packed house, in spite of the sweltering heat.

The fact that Mme. Nordica was here by royal request, however, seems not to be counted either with the management of the opera or with the critics, who take occasion to indicate again their decided preference that foreign singers remain away. The press laments the appearance of foreign talent on the domestic stage, and the dean of Berlin critics remarks that Mme. Nordica may be good enough for America and England, but not for Germany.

This is the second outbreak of the kind this week. Alice Nielsen, who took the part of Mimi in Puccini's "La Boheme" at the Opera Comique the previous night, coming in for even severer treatment.

Jersey Bull Sells for Fifteen Thousand Dollars

ALLENTOWN, Pa., May 31.—A Lexington, Ky., cattle breeder is today the owner of the Jersey bull Notie, white Cooper & Sons, who sold the animal, hold a receipt for \$15,000. The same buyer also paid \$7,000 for the bull's dam. A total of \$22,000 was paid for his head of cattle.

Three More Arrested In Dynamiting Case

LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 31.—Three more labor men are now under arrest in connection with the dynamite outrages. Bert Connors and A. E. Maple, ironworkers, and Ira Bender, president of Union No. 22, of the International Brotherhood of Blacksmiths and Helpers, are charged with an attempt to blow up the Hall of Records on September 9, 1910. The three are held in jail in default of \$3,000 bonds.

Man and Wife Held for Murder of Her Daughter

WEBSTER, Pa., May 31.—Mr. and Mrs. John Stevenson are held for investigation of the death yesterday morning of Stevenson's stepdaughter, Mrs. Susan Wentz, aged twenty-eight years. Her body, with her throat cut, was found blocking the stairs of the Stevenson home. An outside door was ajar.
