

### PHYSICIAN URGES SIMPLE LIFE FOR ADOLESCENT GIRL

Dr. Elnora T. Folkmar Says She Should Have But Few Social Engagements.

"The adolescent girl should lead a most simple life," said Dr. Elnora T. Folkmar, of the Woman's Clinic, addressing the Mothers' Club of the Cleveland Park school on "The Health of Girls" this afternoon.

"Adolescence is the time when the wise parent and the prudent teacher should often have ears and hear not, eyes and see not," said the doctor. "It is a period when a girl needs the most careful, intelligent and sympathetic handling; otherwise her future mental and physical health may be a wreck."
