NEW YORK STOCKS SUFFER FROM TURN IN EUROPEAN MARKET

Rumors of Break Among Balkan Allies Has Depressing Effect.

NEW YORK, Jan. 10.—The unfavorable turn in the peace situation in Europe started prices downward on the London exchange this morning and New York followed the example.

There were few gains recorded in the list. Among these few American securities gained the most, a point and a quarter, and Western Maryland preferred, a point. Southern Pacific retained its strength and so did Baltimore and Ohio. Others which kept up were New York, Ontario and Western, Great Northern Ore and Denver, preferred.

Although money is at 2 1/2% investors are holding back and the trading continues professional, but the market for bonds and short-term notes is improving.

The steel tonnage report at noon showed an increase of 70,210 tons. The price of refined petroleum has advanced 2 1/2 points.

It is rumored that an extra payment is to be made by the Consolidated Gas Company at the end of this month to New York City, for the use of the city for another year.

Another engagement of cold bars for export to Paris has been made provisionally at the assay price. It is expected to be about \$2,000,000.
