

WILSON MAY DECIDE FATE OF SIX-YEAR PRESIDENTIAL TERM

Bryan Is Also Suspected as One of Men Who May Untangle Knotty Problem.

President-elect Wilson probably will say the word which will determine the fate of the six-year-term resolution in the House.

The House leaders are "up in the air" over the problem, and an informal conference of Democratic chiefs will be held early this week.

It is generally argued that the six-year-term resolution adopted by the Senate would increase Wilson's term two years, provided the amendment were ratified during the first four years of office.

Some of the Democrats in the House think the President-elect ought to be consulted about a six-year term instead of a possible eight-year term.

Mr. Bryan, however, thinks it is better to leave the matter to the President-elect, who will have to make a decision on the subject.
