


Type of Armored Car Used by Huerta in Mexico

AMERICANS FLEE FROM MEXICAN FRAY

Refugees Reach Los Angeles, Fearing Attacks By the Yaqui Indians.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., July 5.—The first party of American refugees from Guaymas, Mexico, has just reached here.

According to stories told by them a number of ranches in the Yaqui valley already have been raided by the Indians, and many Mexicans who resisted the attacks were killed.

The party had great difficulty in getting transportation facilities. On the day the rebels invaded the city they succeeded in chartering a freight steamer which brought them to the Gulf of California to the Colorado river, where automobiles met the steamer and transported them across the desert to Yuma.

According to members of the party the feeling against Americans in Guaymas, particularly the railroad people, is very bitter.

"Wife" Is Discovered; "Husband" Is Held

Ernest Warder, of 217 South Alfred street, Alexandria, Va., has found his "wife" Stella, and as a result, he is being held at the First precinct police station until the Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Justice completes an investigation under the Mann white slave law.

Warder, alias, Ernest Rosser, sought the aid of the police and press in finding his wife, and gained wide publicity. Last night his "wife" was found in a resort and taken to the First precinct. She said she was not married to Warder or Rosser. The "husband" was summoned, and then held pending the investigation of the case. The woman says that she came to Washington from Alexandria with Warder and that they described themselves as Mr. and Mrs. Rosser while living in H street.

Policeman J. R. Lantier found the woman. She has been twice married, she said, her first husband having died, and the second divorced her. She gave her maiden name as Victoria Gwynn, of Hillsville, Va.

BOSTON, July 6.—The car strike which last week appeared inevitable, and which was expected to be called tomorrow, has been deferred till Tuesday, when the chamber of commerce will make a last effort to effect a compromise which will prevent the 8,200 men from striking.

WOMAN IS ACCUSED OF HUSBAND'S DEATH

Police Say She Has Admitted Killing Man Whose Body Was Found in Woods.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., July 6.—Had she kept silent about the disappearance of her husband, Mrs. Bessie Wakefield probably never would have been suspected of his murder. But she came to the police again and again with word that he had disappeared, and now she and James Plew, her friend, face a charge of murdering William Wakefield.

The police say the woman has confessed. The woman and her husband had come here from Bristol two months ago. Plew came about the same time. They had quarreled over Plew, but became reconciled. They had few friends, no intimates.

Wakefield disappeared. The neighbors did not notice it, for he often was gone. But Mrs. Wakefield went to the police, told them her husband was gone, and declared she believed he had committed suicide. She begged them to help her find him.

The police made cursory investigations while an unidentified body, mangled almost beyond recognition, was found in the Cheshire woods and quickly buried.

Mrs. Wakefield went again to the police seeking news, and again, they began to suspect her sanity. Then they heard that an unidentified body had been buried in Cheshire, and they had the body disinterred and identified. Mrs. Wakefield and Plew were arrested. The woman was questioned steadily for three hours by Coroner Mix. She denied all knowledge of her husband's death during that time, then suddenly changed, the police say, and calmly told all the dreadful details of the tragedy.

Finds Asylum Better Than Work, Goes Back

BOSTON, July 6.—When William Ross arrived today at the Mattapan Hospital for the Insane, from which he escaped Wednesday, the alienists questioned seriously whether he was crazy.

Ross, after escaping, made his way to Providence, where he obtained employment as a freight handler and worked two days under a broiling sun. He then went to the police and asked them to send him back to the insane asylum.

"I'd have to be crazy to leave a cool place with lots to eat, no work, and to try to shade me, and start juggling freight. Send me back.

The Providence police officer who brought him to Mattapan told the superintendent: "He may be crazy, but he ain't no fool."
