ARMY WANTS CANAL TO CROSS COUNTRY

Engineers Ask \$3,600,000 for Waterway From Florida to Rio Grande.

Federal construction of a great inland waterway, costing \$3,600,000 from Florida to the Rio Grande river, extending along the Gulf of Mexico, as a link in the proposed inter-coastal waterway beginning at Boston, was urged upon Congress today by the board of army engineers. The War Department recommends that a five-foot channel be provided, but disapproves a nine-foot project which would cost nearly \$4,000,000.
