

The petitions signed by the merchants along Seventh street, requesting Congress to authorize new paving along the street were mailed yesterday to the chairman of the Senate and House committees of the District of Columbia, the following letter accompanying: "Permit me to respectfully annex hereto and present the petition of the merchants, business men, and property owners on Seventh street, between New York avenue and Florida avenue northwest, calling to the attention of the committee the present dilapidated condition of the said street and the unsightly, dangerous, and unhealthful condition, with the prayer that your committee will request the urgent need of immediate action in the matter regarding and reinserting in the District appropriation bill the item of \$30,000 asked for by the District Commissioners for the purpose of resurfacing said thoroughfare with asphalt.
