

CLEAN-UP CAMPAIGN DOES GREAT WORK

No Laxity Permitted in Work of Ridding City of Unightly Refuse.

Work together during the last two days of the clean-up week in order to add to the success, already assured, of the campaign for cleanliness.

This was the appeal issued today by the clean city committee to householders everywhere throughout the District. Reports from committees indicate that all previous records will be broken this year, but there will be no laxity on the part of the workers until the last load of refuse is carried to the city dumps.

Careless and dirty habits of citizens call for unnecessary expenditure of public funds, through higher tax rates, and therefore for higher rents. Give this matter thought. Citizens themselves, not the city authorities, are responsible for street litter. A street can be littered by a few careless people much faster than it can be cleaned.

Should Force Action. The proper treatment for offenders of this type is for an officer of the law to take the offender in hand and compel him or her to pick up the litter and deposit it in one of the receptacles provided for such wastes.

Another class of persons who persistently violate the law are storekeepers who sweep their wastes into the streets. Such offenders should be promptly arrested and heavily fined. A few such examples will have the desired effect.

We can only have real clean streets when we have real clean people. Will you not contribute your quota toward making Washington's streets clean?

Results of the campaign are apparent almost everywhere. From vacant lots and yards and vacant lots present an improved appearance. The hundreds of tons of refuse removed by the contractors are certain indications of a thorough cleaning of garrets and cellars.

Last year the number of tons of refuse removed to the dumps during city cleaning week was 6,500. This year, although there is less dirt to remove, the number will be greatly increased, according to Dr. Arthur L. Murray, secretary of the committee.

Committee Gratiified. The readiness with which householders have responded to the appeals of the committee is a source of much gratification, said Dr. Arthur L. Murray, secretary, today.

There still remains, however, much to be accomplished, and it is hoped that there will be no less enthusiasm on the part of the workers during the closing hours of the campaign.

The workers will find their compensation in improvements in health and sanitary conditions, and a lessening of the fly and mosquito population.

Mrs. Charlton M. Clark, chairman of the finance committee, reported today that the fund amounts to \$175. The greater part of this will be used to defray the expense of the printing and distribution of "clean-up" cards, and circulars containing suggestions for improvement in sanitary conditions.

W. H. Richardson, chairman, will call a meeting of the committee next week to consider the reports of committees.
