

SAYS MEN WILL LIVE BY SPIRIT OF LAW

Vice President Marshall Declares the Age of Physical Force Has Passed.

A new era when men will live more by the spirit of the law than by the letter, is foreseen by Vice President Marshall. In an address at the annual banquet of the Junior class of the National Law School at Haverhill last night he declared that outworn precedents were responsible for more trouble, legal and otherwise, than any other cause.

"The practice of law," he said, "has come to be just like running a second-hand clothing store. You strive to fit your client with some preceding case on your shelves. Yet we laugh at the French procedure, which taught to decide a case on a precedent."

The Vice President declared that the age of physical force had passed; that the age of intellectual supremacy in passing, and that mankind is standing at the dawn of a third era in the history of the world, when men shall be governed not by the strict letter of the law, but by its spirit.

John Marshall, speaker of the class of 1917, spoke of "The Voiceless City," comparing the status of the people of the District of Columbia with the territories, and he declared the fact that thousands of taxpayers here live absolutely no voice in the Government.

Miss Emma M. Gillett, dean of the college, declared the opening of the college.

Denver, Feb. 7.—In the most remarkable address ever delivered in the Colorado Legislature, Representative Henry Bolinger, of Gilpin county, a leader of the house, said yesterday he had twice been an inmate of insane asylums. He described his own case, and told of his escape and made a plea that resulted in the passage of a resolution for immediate investigation of all institutions for the insane in this state.
