All accounts agreed that the storm of the Cape last night was no force and the night so thick that a vessel, unless all its lights were on, could not have been seen 100 feet away.

The Coast Guard Service said it had received a word by wireless concerning the Eitel's reported escape. Referring to reports of activity on German ships in New York and Boston harbors, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Peter said it was conceivable that a concerted dash might be made, in which the vessels might get by the American Government craft on guard and escape to sea.

AMERICAN SAILORS KEPT IN VERA CRUZ
