Germans Erect Steel Plates Before Trenches

ROTTERDAM, April 4.—German troops in Flanders are now erecting steel plates in front of their trenches, with the intention of offering the most stubborn resistance possible to the expected attacks of the allies, according to dispatches brought here today.

SANDUSKY, Ohio, April 4.—James Smith, thirty-five, of Castalia, has been received at the county jail to serve 527 days for drunkenness.


