

TAKOMA'S STREETS READY NEXT MONTH

More Than Half of New Concrete Thoroughfares Already Completed, Says Report.

With more than half of Takoma Park's three miles of new concrete streets completed, and with every indication that the entire system will be ready by November 15, the municipality is keeping close to the original estimated cost of the work, according to an extended statement regarding the work made at the meeting of the council last night by Councilman L. R. Grubill, chairman of the street committee.

Only Two Avenues Left.

Work is now completed on Oak, Maple, Willow, Tulip and a portion of Holly avenues, leaving only Chestnut and Takoma avenues to be finished. With Carroll avenue, which has been macadamized for some years, these embrace the principal thoroughfares of the town. The portion of Takoma avenue between Philadelphia avenue and Albany avenue will be thirty feet wide instead of twenty-four feet, which had been originally planned, as the result of a petition to this effect from interested property owners.

The installation of 1,200 feet of sewer and 400 feet of watermain on Carroll and Boyd avenues to supply the property of Fred L. Glaise, of Winchester, Pa., was approved conditionally upon Mr. Glaise dedicating the streets in his property to the municipality.

Macadamization Ordered.

Chicago avenue, from the Baltimore and Ohio railroad bridge to Takoma avenue, will be macadamized, and Carroll avenue will be oiled its entire length, the council having ordered the work last night.

The treasurer's report submitted by Town Clerk and Treasurer Ben G. Davis, showed receipts of \$21,077, and disbursements of \$23,741, the net result of expense being a payment of \$2,664 on the new streets. This amount has been restored to the treasury, however, by floating \$2,000 of bonds, the municipality will receive from the property owners affected two-thirds of the cost of the street construction, however, payable annually for five years.

DENOUNCES MARKET CONDITIONS IN CITY

After hearing an indictment by Dr. Lewis J. Battle of "horrible sanitary conditions in public markets of Washington," the Piney Branch Citizens' Association at its first fall meeting last night instructed the public health committee, of which Dr. Battle is chairman, to submit a complete report on market conditions in the city.

"Conditions in some Washington markets are absolutely rotten," Dr. Battle said. "Perishable meats stand in mid-summer unrefrigerated from flies, insects, dust and dirt on tables without screens. Bread on counters is handled by customers in a manner that may spread tuberculosis and other diseases."
