

\$150,000 SAVING ON SCHOOL SITE URGED

East Washington Citizens Would Provide For Cadets' Camp on Reservation 13.

The District Commissioners today received a copy of a resolution adopted by the East Washington Citizens' Association last night, in which they are urged to call a public hearing on the question of selecting a new site for the proposed Eastern High School, with particular reference to considering the advisability of utilizing part of the tract of seventy-five acres in reservation 13, east of Nineteenth and south of A streets southeast, as a site.

By selection of this site, the resolution urges, the Commissioners will save the \$150,000 appropriated for the purchase of a site, as the Government now owns the reservation. Part of the site will be ground available for the proposed camp of military instruction for high school cadets. Reservation 13 is within one square of the proposed site, which was recently rejected by the Commissioners on the grounds that the awards of \$123,000 for private property in the square was excessive. Part of the buildings on reservation 13, the old jail, the old workhouse, the Washington Aylum Hospital, and the contagious hospital, could be utilized in the construction of the proposed school, the resolution recites. But whether this site is adopted or not the citizens urge that a public hearing be called to hear all sides.

A resolution urging that four armories for the District National Guard be provided, one in each section of the city, was debated. The question was referred to the executive committee. The association passed a resolution favoring a 40 per cent increase in pay for Washington school janitors.

Dr. Charles M. Emmons was re-elected president, and C. Howard Buckler secretary and treasurer of the association. Charles A. Shields, W. H. Cross, J. H. Adams, and Thomas W. Smith were elected members of the executive committee.

The explosion followed. She was burned slightly about the head, and rendered unconscious by the flow of the fumes which followed.


