

TRYING TO GET MEN HIGHER UP IN PLOTS

Federal Officials to Be Given List of 300 Alleged Participants by Goricar.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—Federal officials focused their efforts on New York today in a many-angled attempt to reach "men higher up" in alleged illegal German propaganda.

Dr. Joseph Goricar, former Austrian consul at San Francisco, whose arrest was announced by the department of justice authorities to speed action, was in conference with Chief Flynn, of the Secret Service, and representatives of the Federal district attorney's office today.

Goricar, it was reported, would present a list of 300 names of men, including many bankers, alleged to have furnished money or otherwise aided activity of Austro-German spies.

Assistant District Attorney Woods plans to set the trial of Karl Bueda, general manager of the Hamburg-American line, and other officials of the company for Monday. They are charged with entering into manifests with a view to furnishing supplies for German commerce raiders.

Food Riots in Berlin Said to Occur Daily

LONDON, Nov. 17.—Daily food riots in Berlin, with threats from the authorities that the ringleaders will be shot if the disorders continue, are reported today in Copenhagen dispatches.

The smashing of shop windows and looting by throngs of needy people in the German capital are of daily occurrence, the reports say. Warnings of punishment have been placarded throughout the city by the ministry of the interior. Besides death for the leaders, all participants are advised that they risk ten-year terms of imprisonment.

MASON SAYS BRITISH SEEK ARMY REFORM

Probe of Loos Failure Indicative of Desire to Remedy Staff Failures.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—Announcement in London that an inquiry has been ordered into the failure of British reserves to arrive in time for the scheduled form of attack and tragic delays interfered with proper re-enforcement of the advanced line.

The long delay in using reserves during the Arras offensive is, in fact, the third occasion when hesitation and failure to throw troops forward at crucial moments have prevented large British successes in the present war.

The first of the series of failures occurred at the battle of Neuve Chapelle. The British report on that unfortunate engagement shows only a part of the first line troops carried out the scheduled form of attack and tragic delays interfered with proper re-enforcement of the advanced line.

The second failure was at Suvla bay, on the Gallipoli peninsula. A carefully planned landing was made with sufficient rapidity to take the Turks by surprise, but, thereafter, the same indecision that had developed at Neuve Chapelle robbed the British of an important victory. Re-enforcements were not hurried into battle, and the thin lines of men who charged first against the Turkish positions could not hold indefinitely without support.

The persistent hesitation thus shown to exist among British officers is being attributed in London to faulty staff work. This, without doubt, is true. The chief faults of the staffs are, apparently, found to be a failure to make quick decisions under the conditions that constantly arise as every great battle develops. The British staffs are capable of planning a battle admirably in advance, but, thereafter, they depend too much on luck and demoralization of the troops.

Lord Kitchener's discouragement of staff work when he became minister of war probably has been an important contributing factor in the failure to regard their responsibilities less seriously than they ought.

The Loos investigation may result in large reforms which Lord Kitchener cannot override.

SUBMARINE SINKS ITALIAN STEAMSHIP

Austrians Attack Vessel Off Sicilian Coast Bound From Tripoli.

ROME, Nov. 17.—Following reports of heavy cannonading off the Sicilian coast, it is reported here today that an Italian torpedo-boat flotilla has chased and sunk an Austrian submarine.

ROME, Nov. 17.—The Italian passenger steamship Bormida has been sunk by a submarine. All on board are reported to have been saved.

The Bormida, 2,352 tons, was owned by the Societa Italiana di Servizi Marittimi. Its home port was Venice. A German submarine stopped the Italian steamship Milano in the Mediterranean, but spared the vessel because there were several German-Americans on board. That the undersize boat was "German" was distinctly stated in the announcement today.

APPEAL FOR HELP OF STARVING SERBIA

American Relief Committee Launches New Campaign to Aid Stricken Nation.

NEW YORK, Nov. 17.—Aroused by the pitiable condition of Serbia, best on three sides by enemies, and particularly by the suffering of thousands of women and children refugees pouring into northern Greece and Montenegro, the Serbian American relief committee today launched anew the campaign to get relief to the poverty-stricken nation.

"Conditions as described by Minister Vesitch to William Philip Simms, United Press correspondent, in Paris, Monday, demand immediate relief," it was stated.

A shipment of supplies will be forwarded within the next two weeks via Greek steamer to Athens, and thence by pack trains to northern Greece. In the meantime, \$30,000 in clothing, bacon, corn meal, sugar, condensed milk, quinine, bicarbonate of soda, iodoforn, and other drugs.

Scratched Throat of Robber, Says Victim

Robert Gibbs and James Washington, two young colored men who live in Brookland, were arrested early today by Policeman Hauser charged with robbery.

They are accused of having obtained a small amount of money from William Jackson, of 411 New York avenue, near Seventh and Munroe streets northwest, about 1:30 o'clock.

A scratch on the throat, from a safety pin which Jackson says he used to mark his assailant, may be a feature of the evidence in the case, the police say.






