A few months ago Miss Destinn created quite a sensation in musical circles by renouncing her Austrian citizenship in order to become a naturalized American.

Fritz Kreisler, the great violinist, will give his only recital in Washington this season, at the National Theater, December 3, at 4:30, under the management of Mrs. Wilson-Greens.

Miniature opera will be given for the benefit of the Christ Child Society on December 3, at the Belasco Theater, by Greta Torpade, the young Swedish soprano, and Einar Linden, the celebrated tenor of the Copenhagen, Paris and Berlin operas.

Theodor Leschetzky Dies.

Theodor Leschetzky, long deemed the most famous pianoforte teacher in the world, died on November 17 in Dresden at the age of eighty-five.

Vienna was his home, but lately he took up his residence at a village near Dresden. Paderewski studied under him.

Leschetzky was famous as a teacher and when he resided in Vienna more pupils sought his tutorage than he could receive, so that he restricted his attention to the most advanced players only. Some of his pupils became teachers under his method and sent pupils to him after a year's study.

His debut was made in Vienna in 1846.
