CANNOT USE PARK FOR DRILL GROUND

District Militia's Request For Privilege Denied By Secretary of War Garrison.

(Continued from First Page.) The buildings and grounds, who commented as follows: "By act approved March 3, 1897 (29 Stat., p. 620), it is provided that the entire area formerly known as the Potomac Park and then being reclaimed, and the same are hereby made and declared a public park under the name of the Potomac Park, and to be forever held and used as a park for the recreation and pleasure of the people."

Development Plans. "To meet suggestions which have been made by members of the Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives, a comprehensive plan has been prepared for the development of East Potomac Park as public recreation grounds, and will be submitted in a few days.

Only Objection. "The only objection to the use of the grounds at Fort Myer is stated to be their inconvenience of access, but it does not appear to be incumbent upon the department of parks to remedy this by permitting the use of park areas which have been dedicated to other purposes."

Request For Grounds Based on Desire to Have Mounted Drill

The proposal to utilize a part of Potomac Park as a drill field for the field artillery of the District militia was made by Brigadier General Harvey because he understood that the extreme southern portion of the park had not been improved or was not now being used for any specific purpose.

"I wanted to use the park because of its convenience, and because it is the only place around here, outside of the field at Fort Myer, where we could have mounted artillery drill," said Brigadier General Harvey. "There are thirty horses in our stables, furnished by the Federal Government, which are eating their heads off. I thought the use of the park would give us more opportunities for mounted drill and for putting these horses to work."
