District Attorney Objects to Opening Address of John B. Stanchfield.

Officers of the bank not only desired not to conceal anything, but in the language of the day, placed their cards on the table in a letter from John Skelton Williams on July 14, 1914, a year previous to the filing of the equity suit.

Reason For Injunction.

The withholding of \$5,000 due the bank on Government bonds and the withdrawal of government deposits and the funds of the American Red Cross also were alleged to be acts of the Comptroller that finally resulted in the filing of injunction proceedings by the bank.

Daeling as Individuals.

Mr. Stanchfield sought to impress on the jury that the defense would attempt to prove that Mr. Glover and the Messrs. Flather, when they made the affidavit on which the present case is based, they were not dealing as individuals.

Mr. Stanchfield declared that Comptroller Williams had gone out of his way to persecute the officers of the bank.

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Flather. A letter was received from Mr. Williams replying that certain statements of Mr. Glover were false.

Commissions Account.

Mr. Stanchfield then began reading more excerpts of letters showing how money earned by the bank's officers individually was turned over to the bank. He explained how the bank used the money in the "commissions account," saying that when the bank made contributions to the Red Cross, for inaugural ceremonies and other similar things, the contribution was taken from the commission account.

Second Clash Occurs.

District Attorney Laskey continued to protest against the reading of certain letters by the defense, and Mr. Stanchfield replied that Mr. Laskey had made statements yesterday in his opening statement "which will be clearly inadmissible."

Quotes Untermyer.

Mr. Stanchfield quoted Samuel Untermyer as saying during the trial of the civil suit instituted by the bank against the Treasury officials that the bank had never been speculating.
