

NORTHERN MEXICO IS ABAZE WITH ANTI-AMERICANISM

Officials in Washington Seriously Concerned Over Reports of Hostile Demonstrations.

CARRANZISTAS FAIL TO ACT

PARIS, June 10.—German artillery attacks on the forts of Souville and Tavennes, between Fort Vaux and Verdun, are under way, according to the official statement of the French war office today. Souville is on a line direct from Fort Vaux, now held by the Germans, and Verdun. Tavennes is about a mile southeast of Souville. Fort St. Michel stands between them and Verdun.


CROOK WAS CROOKED; LEGS IDENTIFY HIM
