

Wedding Is Kept Secret for Year

Baltimore Society Surprised by News of Marriage of Jurist's Daughter.

BALTIMORE, Aug. 15.—Friends of Miss Sallie H. Ambler, daughter of the late Justice James M. Ambler, were surprised today when they learned of her marriage a year ago to James B. Kempton, of Philadelphia. Until two months ago Mrs. Kempton had lived at the Ambler home.

There were two marriage ceremonies. The first was performed in Philadelphia in July, 1925, by a justice of the peace; the second in Philadelphia about five weeks ago by a minister of the Protestant Episcopal Church, in accordance with the wishes expressed by members of the Ambler family.

Mr. Kempton is said to have been engaged in the stock brokerage business in Philadelphia.
