TO CIRCLE GLOBE IN AEROPLANE—MAYBE

Congressman J. A. Oskz Would Encompass World in Week in Marvelous Machine.

Congressman J. A. Oskz, fired with ardor by the accounts of the wonderful progress being made in Europe, has formed an aeroplane company, the purpose of which is to build aeroplanes capable of circumnavigating the globe in one week.

It will be a biplane with two six-bladed propellers. The Congressman has figured out that if an aeroplane can go 100 miles an hour with a two-bladed propeller, it ought to make at least 500 miles with a six-bladed one. Progress on the machine was delayed a bit at the start, as the designer had a few odd plumbing jobs to attend to.

SHOULD PREPARE CAR FOR COLD WEATHER

Charles E. Miller, Local Dorr Distributor, Explains What Owners Ought to Do.

"Your car needs definite preparation for the cold weather, if you are going to drive it this winter," said Charles E. Miller, local Dorr distributor, yesterday. "Of course, you will put an anti-freeze solution in your radiator and get out your radiator cover, or buy a new one, as the case may be. The best and safest anti-freeze solution can be made of denatured alcohol and water."

Next Step To Be Taken

"The next step is to check over your carburetion and ignition. The carburetor should be adjusted so it will get a very rich mixture. This will enable your engine to start quickly and save your storage battery. If you own a Dorr you should omit this precaution, for the Dorr is equipped with a carburetor dash adjustment, which you can set from your seat at the wheel.

Tremendous Strain

"The drain on your battery in starting is tremendous under ordinary conditions, and when you keep your foot on the starting button for a minute or two at a time your battery is going to run down very quickly, unless you are doing a great deal of driving at charging speed. Economical use of your battery is another factor in saving your battery. Look after your tires, too. If a tire is flat or more tires that are badly worn, take it off and keep it for a spare.


