

REPUBLICANS HOPE FOR A MAJORITY OF THIRTY IN THE HOUSE

Senate Much in Doubt, But G. O. P. Has Chance for Small Lead.

With the election close at hand the best information obtainable in Washington is that the Democratic majority in the House of Representatives will be overturned but that the Senate will be closely divided.

Even with a nominal Republican majority the attitude of several Senators of the Progressive type makes the power of the Republicans to concentrate upon a comprehensive legislative plan somewhat doubtful.

Two Progressive Republicans, La. Follette and Poindexter, now regular Republican nominees, voted for the Underwood-Simmons tariff law. A third, Kenyon of Iowa, was disposed to do the same but was talked out of it.

The Republicans may lose two or more of their nominees for the Senate according to surface indications. But for this fact they might reasonably hope to have a majority on the gains conceded to them.

How the House Looks. The House of Representatives, as the situation now appears, will have a Republican majority of from fifteen to twenty-five, or possibly thirty.
