

AUTOS WILL PARADE IN ELECTRICAL WEEK

Illumination of Statue of Liberty to Be Feature of National Celebration.

A monster automobile parade, with appropriate pageantry, will inaugurate Washington's part of "America's Electric Week," which begins December 2.

The electrical show to be held in the four-story building at 1212 G street northwest, will be thrown open to the public, with every electrical appliance known on exhibition.

The event, however, which will start the week with a flourish, will be the lighting of the Statue of Liberty. The gift of the French people to the United States will finally be brilliantly illuminated after thirty years of darkness at night time.

Emblem of Americanism. This statue for that time has stood the emblem of everything intensely American, and it is expected that lighting the statue will be in the rank of the unveiling of Washington's monument and the recent consecration of Lincoln's tomb.

Cities and towns throughout the entire country will also celebrate this night by opening an electrical exhibition. The arrangements for Washington's festival of ions and amperes are in charge of John C. McLaughlin, manager of the commercial department of the Potomac Electric Power Company. He has planned for an automobile parade, pageantry, and many other interesting features.

To Use Flood of Light. Harold A. Brooks, chairman of the outdoor illumination committee of the local participation of America's Electrical Week in association with L. S. Helm, R. B. Patterson, and W. S. Madigan, members of the committee, all connected with the engineering staff of the Potomac Electric Power Company, has perfected plans for the flood lighting of the G street building, in which the electrical exposition will be held.

It is also expected that the statues in the parks and circles of Washington will also be illuminated by flood light method during the eight-day period of electrical week observance, and it is possible that arrangements will be made during the coming week for the outside illumination of the District and Government buildings and the Washington Monument.

SISTER TAKEN ILL AT SCHOOL AND DIES

Girls at Notre Dame Academy to Attend Funeral.

Sister Josephine of the Assumption, a teacher at Notre Dame Academy, North Capitol and K streets northeast, was taken suddenly ill at the academy yesterday afternoon and died within half an hour.

The five hundred or more girls of the academy will attend the requiem funeral mass at St. Aloysius' Church at 9 o'clock tomorrow morning. Burial will be in Mt. Olivet Cemetery. Sister Josephine was 39 years old, and a native of Massachusetts. She entered the order of Notre Dame in 1907, three years ago, and had taught in the schools of the order in all parts of the country. She came here about four years ago.

SECRETARY WILSON AT BROTHER'S BIER

Cabinet Member's Relative Killed by Rock Fall in Mine.

William H. Wilson, secretary of Labor, left Washington last night at 10:45 o'clock for St. Benedict, Pa., to attend the funeral of his brother, Joseph Wilson, who was killed in a mine accident there yesterday.

Secretary Wilson was accompanied by his daughter, Miss Mary Wilson, and his son, Joseph P. Wilson. He was obliged to cancel his appointment to go to the White House with delegates of the American Federation of Labor.

Joseph Wilson was fifty-two years of age and a skilled miner. He leaves a wife and two daughters. With his companion, Morgan Herron, he was placing pillars in a mine of the Carleton Coal Company at St. Benedict, when a rock fourteen feet long and a foot thick fell from the roof of the mine, pinning him under.

Herron tried to release, but was unable. Then he gave the alarm, and the rock was dug away, but it was found that it had crushed Wilson's head and body, and his death had been almost instantaneous.

Wilson went to St. Benedict about twelve years ago from Weilsboro, and was one of the best known miners in the region. His brother, Secretary Wilson, is also an experienced miner, and at one time was secretary-treasurer of the Miners' Union before coming to Congress.
