

VAST WAR PLANTS READY FOR U. S. USE

Factories Developed Here By Allies Can Supply the Army With All It Needs.

NEW YORK, April 3.—The position attained by American manufacturers of explosives and other war materials in supplying the entente allies and their ability to come promptly to the aid of the United States in the prosecution of war with Germany are shown in a compilation issued by the National City Bank...

Some of the striking munition exports enumerated by the bank since the war began, compared with the two and one-half year period before hostilities, are: Explosives \$902,000,000, against \$14,000,000; manufactures of brass, chiefly material for shells, \$407,000,000, against \$21,000,000; manufactures of iron and steel, chiefly for war purposes, \$1,434,000,000, against \$499,000,000...

Total Trade. The total trade of the United States in the first two and one-half years of the war was \$15,623,000,000, against \$10,490,000,000 in the corresponding period preceding the war. Exports under the stimulus of war trading reached a total of \$10,562,000,000, against \$5,852,000,000, and imports \$5,061,000,000, against \$4,638,000,000.

Exports to North America are \$1,771,000,000, against \$1,423,000,000; South America, \$417,000,000, against \$325,000,000; Asia (exclusive of material for Russia via Vladivostok), \$384,000,000, against \$290,000,000; Europe, \$7,645,000,000, against \$3,556,000,000.

Chief Increase. The bank's analysis shows that the chief increase in imports was in manufacturing material, being \$2,015,000,000 in the war period, against \$1,582,000,000 and foodstuffs were \$1,337,000,000, against \$1,128,000,000.

MILITARY CENSUS OF DISTRICT URGED

Committee, Representing Hundreds of Preparedness Workers, Sees Commissioners.

Representing several hundred citizens who are advocates of the preparedness movement, a committee consisting of Frederick L. Heidekoper, chairman; Edward J. Stullwagen, and W. D. Hoover, called on the District Commissioners today to urge that immediate steps be taken to have a complete military census made of all male citizens above the age of eighteen in the District...

The committee was received by all three Commissioners. Assurances were given that the recommendations would be given consideration, being in line with plans already formulated. The following letter was left with the board: "In advocating such an enumeration, this committee is of the opinion that we should endeavor to profit by the experience of other nations under similar conditions and to anticipate a step which is indispensably necessary for the maintenance of the power of the nation to be utilized effectively in war."

Champion of Preparedness. Mr. Heidekoper is one of the vice presidents of the National Security League and has long been one of the foremost champions of preparedness. The Commissioners have announced that endeavor will be made to obtain an early appropriation from Congress for carrying into effect the law of March 1, 1899, providing for a military census of the District.

EX-POLICEMAN SENTENCED

G. T. Hilton to Serve 18 Months for House Breaking. A sentence of eighteen months' imprisonment was imposed today by Judge Gould on George T. Hilton, formerly a policeman, who recently was convicted of housebreaking. Hilton was found guilty of entering the garage of Charles H. Church, in southwest Washington, on November 1, 1914, and removing automobile parts valued at more than \$24.

D. C. SPORTSMEN WAR ENGROSSED

In the event that colleges scheduled with Georgetown call off their games here Georgetown will give up the baseball campaign to follow in line with other institutions.

Robert H. Young, president of the Amateur Baseball Association of the District, which comprises eight amateur baseball leagues, will call a meeting shortly to determine what steps will be taken by the amateurs in the event of war.

The amateur league president has signed his intention of recruiting a company or battalion from the ranks of the amateurs having had experience in the national guard as captain some years ago.
