IS BEBUKED BY JOHNSON Senator Tells Hoover Committee Is After Facts.

(Continued from First Page.) are after. The question is not whether something is intercepted, it is whether the statement is a fact.

After stating that the testimony of the three men were taken before a court of justice the interrogations would be stricken out, Attorney Hoover said: "I will not press the matter further."

Conciliator Blackman then stated that he had no intention of coloring his testimony, but merely wantonly to explain a misunderstanding that it was a fifty-fifty proposition, with the men making allegations as well as the company.

One of the most significant statements made by Mr. Blackman was that he and the District Commissioner, as well as Secretary of Labor Wilson, exerted earnest efforts to have Congress investigate the strike because they believed that there was something ulterior connected with it.

"We helped all along to get an investigation," said the witness. "We had a suspicion that there was something under cover. We thought that there was something at the bottom of it."

"When did you get that suspicion—after you saw the men had lost the strike?" asked Attorney Hoover. "They haven't lost it yet," interjected Attorney James H. Vahey, representing the strikers.

"Well, the operation of the cars seems to indicate that they have," replied Attorney Hoover. "The witness said that he had his suspicions from the first when Clarence P. King, president of the company, steadfastly refused to deal with the grouped men on any basis whatsoever."

"Hints at Shaded Testimony." "Did you ever communicate your suspicions to Mr. King?" he was asked by Attorney Hoover. "I did not," responded the conciliator, "because I did not believe that my suspicion would have any effect on Mr. King so far as his yielding anything or agreeing to mediation was concerned."

All of Attorney Hoover's questions were tinged with vigor and something akin to asperity, his evident intention being to show that throughout all of Mr. Blackman's testimony yesterday, conciliator Blackman applied the shading brush liberally.

At the outset of the cross examination Attorney Hoover tackled the witness with some questions to learn what authority had been given for consulting the company's books to see how much money it had during the first month of the strike. The company did not like this, Attorney Hoover made that plain yesterday and more plain today.

ANGELO DISPLACES HUMOR OF FISHER Milwaukee Art Director Tells of Cultivating Taste.

FEDERATION MEETING HERE George Breed Zug Favors Galleries in Colleges.

The person who once attained appreciation for the works of Michael Angelo loses all enjoyment of Mutt and Jeff, according to Dudley Crafts Watson, director of the Milwaukee Art Institute and the first speaker at today's session of the eighth annual convention of the American Federation of Arts at the Raleigh.

"When a person first buys a phonograph he purchases ragtime and turkey trot records. Gradually, however, his taste for classical music is cultivated until, usually, at the end of two years he changes to Wagnerian and Chopin records."

"I am sorry to say that I do not believe that the average person can be a student educated in an appreciation of high art, but I am certain that anyone who once enjoys the masterpieces of Michael Angelo will lose all interest in Mutt and Jeff."

"Art in State Fairs" was the subject of Mr. Watson's address, and he declared that he believed that more appreciation of art was gained from the great mass of American people who gathered at the World's Fair at Chicago than from all of the museums then in the country. "All people have to do to enjoy art," Mr. Watson said, "is to open their eyes to it."

George Breed Zug, art instructor of Dartmouth College, who addressed the convention on "Art Exhibitions in Colleges," in supporting his contention that American colleges should contain art exhibitions, said: "If a student learns to swim without water, and if he cannot learn to play golf without touching a club or ball so he cannot really learn to appreciate the higher qualities of the arts, and to appreciate the meaning of great painting, great sculpture, or great stitching without originals."

"In regard to the need for exhibitions in colleges it may not be universally appreciated that the very size of our great municipal museums is discouraging and confusing to young people, not to say fatiguing. After summing up his array of arguments favoring the creation of individual art exhibitions in those colleges of the country at least which are not so happily situated as to be near museums, Mr. Zug said: "I am not interested in dead facts about art or in the gossip about art, but in the joy, the elation, the broadening view that a wide and responsive acquaintance with original works of art gives. If students of this kind of art history, which in most colleges is called art appreciation, gain benefit by art exhibitions in colleges, academic students of drawing and painting gain an equal benefit. We have plenty of painters—what we need is a demand among the people for great art. The supply will follow the demand."

Mr. George W. Stevens, assistant director of the Toledo Museum of Art, closed the morning session with an address on "Museum Methods."

The speakers this afternoon are George C. Booth, of Detroit, on "The Place of Industrial Art in Art Museums"; Henry Hornbostel, past president of the Society Beaux Arts Architects, on "The Art of the Immigrant"; and H. Percy Macomber, of Boston, on "The Future of the Handicrafts."

U. S. WARNS CUBAN REBELS State Department Determined to Protect Cane Crop. The State Department indicated today its threat of trouble for Cuban rebels if they do not lay down their arms, was largely a precautionary measure.

The rebellion, it was stated, has practically subsided. This Government intends that the cane crops shall be immune from the depredations of the rebels or bandits.
