She consented and the crowd listened for a while to recruiting arguments. When this was over, Miss Hunkins mounted the steps of the army recruiting wagon and campaigned for the "cause."

SENATE TO VOTE FOR DRY NATION, POLL INDICATES

A poll of the Senate taken by the New York Herald indicates that the Sheppard nation-wide prohibition amendment to the Federal Constitution will be adopted when it goes to a vote in the Senate tomorrow afternoon. The resolution requires two-thirds vote for adoption. That means sixty-four votes. If all Senators are present.

The poll shows the "dry" have sixty-eight votes, or four more than necessary number.

The list of "dry" votes includes the names of some of the strongest "wet" Senators, who have now declared their intention of voting for the resolution to get rid of the prohibition issue in Congress.

Sheppard Confident.

Some of the votes, too, will be influenced by the understanding to amend the resolution to provide for the invalidation of the amendment unless it is ratified by a sufficient number of States in six years. Some of the "wets" believe this will be an impossible task for the "dry."

Confidence that both the Senate and the House will vote to submit the proposed national prohibition amendment is expressed by Senator Morris Sheppard of Texas.

Debate on the proposed amendment began yesterday, continued today, and will be concluded Wednesday, when, under an agreement, the vote is to be taken.

Sees Dry Nation Soon.

Senator Sheppard has given out a statement in which he predicts not only that both houses will pass the amendment but that more than three-fourths of the States will ratify it and that in five or six years the whole nation will be dry.

The dry forces, it was learned today, are not certain that they can force the proposed amendment to a vote in the House in the extra session. Their leaders say they can get two-thirds—a number needed for passing the amendment—if they can force a vote.

Senator Underwood attacked the amendment on the ground it would have a tendency to centralize this government "under a police autocracy such as exists in Germany and Austria-Hungary."

Plan Food Clubs To Hit Middlemen and Slash Prices

NEW YORK, July 31.—Food clubs are to be formed in New York by the State Department of Foods and Markets to eliminate the middleman and force down the price of edibles.

Plans for these organizations were announced today. The department proposes that city consumers form clubs of ten or more families, designate some address where food may be received and distributed to members of the club, and designate some person to send in the orders.

BAVARIA FROWNS ON TOURIST RUSH FROM PRUSSIA

BASLE, Switzerland, July 8 (by mail)—Bavaria is preparing, though very reluctantly, for another rush of tourists from north Germany this summer. As the Bavarians regard these visitors from the north more in the light of intruders than welcome guests, especially at this time, when food is exceedingly scarce, measures have been taken to safeguard the smaller localities from being overrun by famished Prussians.

The Bavarian minister of war has, therefore, forbidden by decree parishes of less than 6,000 inhabitants to receive summer boarders, except where it can be proved that the latter have been in the habit of coming there during the last three years.

All who have visited Bavaria and seen what a gold harvest the tourists, and especially the non-German tourists, brought to the country every summer, can easily imagine what invidious comparisons the hotel keepers and boarding house owners must be making between the "Tourist Season" of war and antebellum years.

NAME SOUNDS GERMAN, HE ASKS FOR NEW ONE

Paul Silberstrom, a native of Brest-Litovsk, Russia, thinks his name too German and accordingly has petitioned the District Supreme Court to allow him to change his patronymic to Silvester. His petition, filed today, says that for family reasons he dislikes the idea of changing his name which his father and his ancestors for centuries honored and respected, but he dislikes still more being identified with anything German.

ANARCHISM ON WANE IN NEW YORK CITY

Anarchy in New York has been almost wiped out with the arrest of Emma Goldman and Alexander Berkman, according to Thomas D. McCarthy, United States marshal, who arrested them in an interview here today.

"Since the arrest of these two 'reds,'" said the marshal, "there has not been a single meeting of anarchists in New York, whereas before that time there were half a dozen or more every night."


"Anarchist and socialist meetings in New York had no serious effect on registration or conscription. There have been less than fifty arrests for failure to register and in nearly all cases the persons gave reasonable excuses."


