Country's Death Toll From Today's Heat Totals 332

841 OTHERS PROSTRATED; NO SURCEASE YET IN SIGHT

List of Victims Steadily Increasing—Many Factories Forced to Close Doors—Cool in the Far West.

NEW YORK, Aug. 1.—Three hundred and thirty-two persons have been killed and 841 have been prostrated by the terrific heat of the last three days throughout the country.

In the Middle West some relief came today through rains, but the East continued to smolder.

In New York alone the total deaths will reach fifty and prostrations had mounted to 150 by noon today.

There will be millions slain and countless millions wounded. Every human being in the world will be directly affected by it. All the great nations of the world will be in it. The cost in treasure alone will run away over a hundred billions of dollars. The United States will be in it, will raise millions of soldiers for service in Europe. Flying machines and submarines will revolutionize warfare. Great fleets of aircraft will fly all over Europe, hurrying death and destruction down upon combatants and civilians alike. The bed of the ocean will be carpeted with sunken ships and the waves will be haunted by the cries of the drowning. Battles, terrible beyond the dreams of man, will be fought by millions of men on a side. Women will take the place of men in the factories. Whole nations will put a ban on liquor. 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D. C. Draft Quota Now 1,022 Slackers' Brides Face Jail

CROWDER ORDERS OUT MORE CAPITAL MEN AS RESERVE

The District of Columbia will be required to raise 1,022 men by draft, instead of the original quota of 929. This will be necessary as a result of an order by Provost Marshal General Crowder directing each local board to raise 10 per cent of its quota. The additional 10 per cent is desired as a reservoir from which to draw men to fill vacancies.

Bar "Experiments" On Stomachs of Man o' War's Men

Uncle Sam has put the clamps on experimenters who would try out food and dieting plans on sailors in the navy. A drastic order to enforce rigid inspection of all food for the navy, with instructions to stand alert provisions not up to standard, was issued by the Navy Department today.
