SHENANDOAH VALLEY FIGHTS BABY PLAGUE

Rockingham County Children Ordered to Stay at Home. HARRISONBURG, Va., Aug. 15.—No child under sixteen in Rockingham county, the largest in the State, is allowed to leave his father's premises on account of the prevalence of infantile paralysis in the Shenandoah valley.

At the suggestion of Dr. W. A. Brumfield, assistant health commissioner, \$420 was appropriated by the city supervisors of Harrisonburg, to fight the epidemic. When similar amounts are added from State and national funds, the sum will reach \$1,350.
