CHILDREN TWICE ESCAPE DEATH IN MOTOR ACCIDENTS

PASTOR AND SON MADE TO KNEEL AND KISS FLAG



MRS. BULL'S FIANCE LURED BY SLAYERS, IS POLICE THEORY

BOSTON, Mass., Sept. 8.—Opinion gathered force today that Harold A. Whitman was murdered by some person or persons who lured him into a trap and then struck him down from behind without warning.

The young Melrose chemist, who was found dying from fractures of the skull on the dump in Somerville last Sunday morning, bore no marks beyond the fractures at the top and base of the skull. The absence of other marks on the body and the fact that Whitman's clothing was not torn or severely disarranged, indicates that there was no death grapple or struggle with one or more assailants.

Apparently there were two blows from behind, one on top of the head, the other at the base of the skull. Severe as these blows were, neither one was sufficient to cause instant death. How long Whitman lived after receiving the blows is so far a matter of conjecture. It has been generally assumed, and this assumption still holds good, that the man was attacked first and taken to the dump later.



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
