CHILE IS NEUTRAL IN ACT AND FACT; PLAYS OWN GAME

By ROY W. HOWARD. President of the United Press. SANTIAGO, Chile, March 14.—Ultra-neutral and pro-German elements of the press are suffering from brainstorms today as the result of editorials published in the United States interpreting the Chilean elections as favorable to the allies.

They declare that the intimation that Chile is susceptible to foreign influences is insulting. This attitude is taken, notwithstanding the freely admitted activities of the German South American institute, which is the most pernicious force in furthering German propaganda since the activities of Bernstorff in the United States.

Elections Not Significant. The cold fact is that the elections here afford only the most infinitesimal encouragement for the allies. Naturally, the pro-Allies and those democratically inclined belong to the victorious parties and the pro-Germans are enrolled among the defeated conservatives and clericals. But neither the victor nor the vanquished was committed on issues of the war in the platform.

The results of the election actually were determined by domestic issues and not by international issues. The utmost satisfaction that can be derived by the allies is from the fact that the reorganization congress and ministry certainly are not biased in favor of Germany.

Genuinely Neutral. It is an indisputable fact, derived from a fortnight's interrogation of the best informed individuals of all classes, that Chile now presents the really rarest of international phenomena—a genuinely neutral.

Entirely different from American neutrality, which, after Belgian, was official only, Chilean neutrality is national-wide excepting a limited number of individuals who are partisan, according to their environments and interests. Otherwise the disinterested is absolute.

This disinterest, however, positive is not to be construed as pro-German.

PASSENGER TRAIN SERVICE WILL BE CUT 25 PER CENT

Reductions ranging from 25 to 33 per cent in passenger train service between Chicago and several cities west of the Mississippi will be announced by the Railroad Administration within ten days or two weeks.

Some of the cities to be affected will be St. Paul, Minneapolis, Kansas City, and Omaha, Neb. Railroad Administration heads now are working out the reductions. Cuts are being planned in such a way as not to favor one city over another.

SEABOARD RAILWAY CLERKS AWAITING INCREASE IN PAY

RICHMOND, Va., March 14.—Clerks over the entire system of the Seaboard Air Line Railway are eagerly awaiting the outcome of a conference Vice President Sedden is having in Washington with Director General McAdoo regarding the promised increase in pay to the clerks, which should have been forthcoming on Tuesday.

This increase was promised the clerks as a part of the agreement which was made last February, and was to have included additional pay from October 15, 1918.

No matter what the outcome of the conference in Washington, it is not thought that the clerks will resume their strike. It is believed that a decision will be reached by Friday.
