

U. S. GUNNERS GET TWO MORE U-BOATS; MATE COMMENDED

American gunnery has claimed another submarine victim. The steamer Bortugnoe undoubtedly sank one by the accuracy of its fire, according to Navy Department information published today.

AN ATLANTIC PORT, March 18.—After a fierce battle which lasted more than an hour, the American tank steamship Paulshoro sank a German submarine, it became known today.

The steamer, bearing the scars of the fight and with one wounded sailor aboard, arrived at this port. The sailor was struck by a fragment of a shell fired from the U-boat. The steamer was only slightly damaged. Two shells took effect, but the hits were not serious.

Left February 23. The steamship left a British port February 23, according to members of the crew, and was attacked in the Bristol Channel by a submarine the following day.

A shell from the submarine was sent across the bow of the tanker, and she abandoned her flight to return the fire. For more than an hour the armed guard aboard the steamship exchanged shell for shell with the U-boat.

Square Hit Sinks Sub. Finally one of the gunners aboard the tanker made a square hit amid-ship of the U-boat, which sent her immediately beneath the surface.
