

**CAPE MAY HOTEL  
CONTRACT TO BE  
CANCELED BY U.S.**

Notice to the owners of the Cape May Hotel at Cape May, N. J., that the Government will cancel its lease to the property on July 1 was given by Assistant Secretary of War Crowell today.

An investigation of the contract by the War Department, made at the instance of Representative Bacharach of New Jersey, disclosed that the owners would have received as one year's rental a sum for which they would have been glad to sell the property two years ago.

The hotel was leased to be used as a reconstruction hospital at a yearly rental of \$99,000. The contract was signed by a medical reserve corps officer in the surgeon general's department. Since the hotel would have held 1,100 beds, the rental was at the rate of \$90 a bed space per year.

The investigation showed that the hotel was bought by its present owners for \$75,000. Further, that they swore before the New Jersey tax assessors two years ago that the property was not worth \$100,000 and that they would be very glad to receive that amount in full payment for it. The hotel was built in a land booming scheme and has been operated at a loss of \$15,000 a year ever since it has been open.

The Government contract for \$99,000 yearly rental was to run for the "duration of the war and one year thereafter." Congressman Bacharach was informed by Assistant Secretary Crowell today that he would cancel the lease at the end of the present fiscal year.
