

ALL-STAR CAST TO PLAY "OUT THERE" TO AID RED CROSS

An "all-star" cast, not of three or four stars, but of fifteen of the foremost players on the American stage, will be seen in the unique production to be given in Washington Monday evening, May 13, and the entire proceeds will be turned over to the District of Columbia Red Cross Chapter. That date was announced last evening for the Washington production of "Out There," which is making a three weeks' swing around the big cities of the United States.

The players donate their services and pay their own expenses, and the use of the National Theater, including its attaches and orchestra, has been contributed by Manager Harry Rapley. Among the players in the cast will be George Arliss, George M. Cohan, Mrs. Plake, Viola Allen, James K. Hackett, Julia Sanderson, Laurette Taylor, H. E. Warner and Chauncey Olcott. In addition, "The Star-Spangled Banner" will be sung by a grand opera star of world renown. The production was arranged by these and other players as a means of contributing their share to the campaign of the Red Cross with which to continue its work of mercy. A three weeks' tour was arranged by Klaw & Erlanger and George C. Tyler. The seats range in price from \$5 to \$1, but before they are put on sale there will be a seat auction sale, arrangements for which will be announced later. Rehearsals for the production now are in progress in New York city.

TALKATIVE TURK AT CAMP MEADE HAS NO AUDIENCE

CAMP MEADE, Md., April 30.—Private Asa Abraham, Turk, from Washington, is here among 40,000 soldiers, but cannot find an audience. His little crowd from his end of town has been scattered by transfers. So is puzzled. As soon as anybody gets within ten feet of him he begins to talk.

"Is it that the Sultan would not have me and now the Uncle Sam he won't give me a gun?" he asks. Abraham is very, very fat, and when it comes to talking has been unacquainted with terminal facilities. His stories run on endlessly like the Arabian Nights tales. He was, indeed, a Turkish subject, a Syrian and a Christian, and a hater of the Turkish government, very bitter against the Kaiser, and very fond, indeed, of the Stars and Stripes. This is not the first time he was drafted. The Sultan once picked him for service, but even in Turkey, he said, there are exemption boards or, rather, judges. Abraham said the one way to get an exemption was to enter the room of the judge with eyes closed, with hands outstretched as if groping in darkness, go right up to the judge and feel for the palm of the judge. By leaving money in the itching palm the applicant for exemption is marked down as blind. Abraham did not try that in Washington, because he is willing here to do his bit. He was sad, sad, however, when a shift of forces left him with no one to talk to. The personnel system and the calls from General Pershing have left Abraham alone. He wants to go to war or back to Washington at once. If the army needs a man who can talk freely and abundantly in many Oriental languages Abraham may get a real job yet.


