

CHICAGO BOMB THROWERS IN JAIL

CHICAGO, Sept. 5.—The man who placed the bomb which yesterday killed four persons, injured a score of others and tore a hole in the Federal building here, is today reported under arrest. Officials investigating the crime, however, refuse to confirm the reports circulating at the wrecked Government building.

All night a strong guard, formed of jackies from the Great Lakes naval training station and a detachment rushed from Camp Grant, surrounded the building, while the dragnet was spread for I. W. W. suspects in connection with the explosion. More than 100 are under arrest.

Trap Miscreants. The person who is reported to have placed the bomb is believed to have been one who slept with a Jackie operative of the naval intelligence department Tuesday, and who since has been under surveillance. It was the intention of the Government to capture him in the act, but the trap laid for him miscarried. It is reported, however, that he was captured within an hour and a half of the explosion.

Fearing violence from irate citizens, Federal authorities have thrown a strong guard also around the county jail, where the ninety-seven "Wobblies" sentenced to terms in the Federal penitentiary by Federal Judge Landis last week are being pending the trip to Leavenworth. In the minds of officials who have kept close watch over activities antagonistic to the Government there is no doubt that the crime lies at the door of the organization headed by "Big Bill" Haywood, who himself, under guard in the Government building at the time, felt the shock of the explosion.

Headquarters Searched. I. W. W. quarters have been carefully searched for evidence, and members of the discredited organization number heavily among the arrests made, which also include certain known pro-German propagandists and sympathizers.

Police and Federal operatives, totaling more than 2,000, are still active in the search for persons involved in the outrage, and it is believed important evidence will be made public before night. What may be a further outbreak on the part of I. W. W. sympathizers was reported early today.

Soldiers guarding a manufacturing plant on the southwest side were engaged in combat with a gang of men believed feeling the downtown outbreak of suspects following the explosion.

After a short battle the men jumped into automobiles and fled, but later returned to the scene, the soldiers, who were forced to fire on them.

BANKERS "ESSENTIAL"

Banking has been determined necessary to the conduct of the war, and bank officers and bank employees may claim deferred classification in the draft, according to a statement by Provost Marshal General Crowder. An amendment to the new man power legislation recently passed by Congress changed the provision for persons engaged in industries including agriculture, so as to make it read "Persons engaged in industries, occupations or employments including agriculture, found to be necessary to the maintenance of the military establishment or the effective operation of the military forces or the maintenance of national interest during the emergency."

The effect of this is to remove the danger of a too narrow construction of the word "industries."
