### SPECIAL WAR COURSES

**Military Science and Tactics** under the direction of Major E. V. Bookmiller, U. S. A. The Corps, recognized by the Government as an approved Reserve Officers' Training Corps on February 9, 1918, will receive its military training under the recently promulgated regulations of the S. A. T. C.

**Navigation** based on the sixteen weeks' intensive training course, given for Reserve Officers at Annapolis. Offered primarily for members of the Naval Reserve Force, detailed on duty at Washington, who wish to devote their evenings to self-improvement with a view to advancement in the service, but civilians are not excluded. The classes conducted by the Director of Georgetown College Observatory, begin Sept. 3, 7:30 p. m.

**Fundamentals of Aviation**, embodying Electricity, Radio, Meteorology, Gas Engines, Machine Guns, Theory of Flight, Airplane Structure. The apparatus donated or loaned to the university for aviation purposes, including a practical airplane, machine guns, engines, etc., offers excellent opportunities for didactic and experimental work.

**Radio Telegraphy** comprises a lecture course discussing the electric phenomena and principles of the transmission and reception of electro-magnetic waves. The laboratory work will consist in a thoroughly practical training in code practice, adjustment and tuning of the most modern transmitting and receiving equipment and radio instruments. Special attention in this department to men desiring to enter Government Service. The course is conducted by the Professors of Physics, assisted by government-licensed operators who have seen actual service on the high seas and in the Navy Department.

**The Mathematics of Artillery**—An intensive preparation for the Artillery Branch, covering Plane Trigonometry, Logarithms, Surveying, Topographical Map Reading, the Elements of Spherical Trigonometry.

**Military French**—A double course designed for men knowing no French, and for those of advanced standing. Planned to meet the needs of students for service abroad.
