RED CROSS BEGINS DRIVE FOR 300,000

Have you joined the Red Cross? If not, enlist your dollars with those of the 300,000 adult residents of Washington.

There are now 22,000,000 members of the Red Cross organization in the United States.

Voluntary enrollments will be taken up to Thursday. Then 18,000 uniformed Red Cross workers will canvass the entire city, block by block.

Records of the society show that the Red Cross has provided more than 15,000 nurses to the army corps.

The Red Cross canteen service, composed of 70,000 women, has served American soldiers at 83 canteens night and day.

The Red Cross has built sixty-five Red Cross convalescent houses and 10,000 convalescent robes to outdoor tuberculosis camps.

The Red Cross chapters have, through the efforts of 8,000,000 women, provided our fighting forces and refugees with 72,000 garments of all descriptions.

COBLENTZ, Dec. 14. (Night)—(By Courier to Nancy)—The Americans lacked experience in the technicalities of modern warfare.

That is the opinion of Colonel von Steibel, chief of staff of the Twenty-seventh Division, which fought and was beaten by the Americans in the Argonne.

Von Steibel, who is attached to the German bridgehead commission, discussed freely with the United Press correspondent the reasons of the Argonne break through.

"The Americans were too reckless, in too much of a hurry to get things done," he said.

"For instance, in attacking our machine guns—which are the best in the world—they utilized no scientific means."
