**CITIZENS PLANNING BIG REVIEW HERE**

Plans for a great military spectacle of returning soldiers and military leaders, such as has not been seen since the close of the civil war, as a reception to President Wilson upon his return from France, are being pushed today following a resolution adopted by the Central Citizens' Association last night at their December meeting.

A copy of the resolution, which was offered by the association's new president, Thomas J. Donovan, is today in the hands of the Federation of Citizens' Associations to be forwarded to the Commissioners of the District of Columbia.

"The idea is to take this up through Congress," said Mr. Donovan, "and make it the largest military spectacle ever seen in this country—a grand review on the order of the one which took place just after the civil war, at the time the President returns here."

In addition to Mr. Donovan the following officers were elected for the ensuing year: J. L. Holland and Henry Miller, vice presidents; J. C. Reithart, secretary; John McMahon, treasurer; J. L. Holland and Robert H. McMacken were appointed delegates to the Federation of Citizens' Associations.

The idea of the review was called to the regular monthly meeting of the Georgetown Citizens' Association, when ten new names were added to the roll of members. Attention was called to the need for repairs to Wisconsin avenue, and a committee was elected to investigate and endeavor to expedite the work of construction of the Key bridge.

Disapproval of any increase in the price of gas, opposition to the changed schedules and crowded condition of the cars of the Washington Railway and Electric Company were expressed at last night's meeting of the Takoma Park Citizens' Association. District Food Administrator Wilson was present and spoke on the need for conservation of food for several months yet if the starving people of Europe are to be fed. Dr. C. M. Shoemaker and Dr. C. B. Berman were elected delegates to the Federation of Citizens' Associations.

**JUSTICE PITNEY'S SON IS WOUNDED**

Capt. Shelton Pitney, son of Justice Mahlon Pitney, of the United States Supreme Court, who lives at 3019 Massachusetts avenue northwest, was wounded severely in action on November 7, according to a telegram received by Justice Pitney from the War Department. This is the second time that Captain Pitney has been wounded. The last time was at the battle of the Meuse. His wounds were only slight on that occasion.

Justice Pitney today is holding out hope that this second report is erroneous. His hope is based on the fact that he received a letter from his son on November 2 stating that he was in a French hospital. Justice Pitney does not believe that his son was sent to the front again before the signing of the armistice.

The adjutant general told the justice today that it was unlikely that the report was erroneous. The justice is in hopes that the report of the first wound was probably duplicated. Captain Pitney is a graduate of Princeton College. He left this country for France in May of this year. He is attached to the 313th field artillery.

**CAPITOL UPKEEP COSTS \$182,500 DURING YEAR**

The annual report of Elliott Woods, superintendent of the Capitol building and grounds, shows that \$182,500 was expended in the fiscal year ending last June 30 for the care of the building and grounds, repairs and improvements.

Painting of the Capitol dome was one of the chief items of expense. It is painted every four years and requires 42,536 pounds of paint.

**TRIES TO ASSASSINATE INDO-CHINA GOVERNOR**

HANOI, French Indo-China, Dec. 17.—The life of Albert Sarraut, governor of Indo-China, was attempted at the inauguration of the Sunday fair here.

The shot, which was fired by a disgruntled local government employee named Desvignes, will not prove fatal, it is believed.

**EARL GODWIN PRESIDENT OF NATIONAL PRESS CLUB**

Earl Godwin, editorial writer for The Times, was elected president of the National Press Club yesterday.

**NAVY TO RETURN ALL BORROWED INSTRUMENTS**

Immediate return of all spy-glasses, telescopes, binoculars, and other navigation instruments loaned the Government by individuals, was ordered today by Assistant Secretary of the Navy Roosevelt.

**MAY KEEP UNIFORMS.**

Through the provisions of a bill passed by the House yesterday afternoon, discharged American soldiers, sailors, and marines will be allowed to wear their uniforms as long as they wish instead of being compelled to surrender them at the expiration of three months from the date of discharge.
