RED CROSS WORKERS GET SERVICE CERTIFICATES

All employees of the American Red Cross in Washington who have been in its service six months since the outbreak of the war today are exhibiting certificates of service which were awarded them yesterday at a meeting in the Convention Hall of the Daughters of the American Revolution. Badges of service for the women and buttons for the men were also distributed. The awards were made by Elliot Wadsworth, acting chairman. Every one of the 250,000 employees of the American Red Cross throughout the world, in time, will receive similar certificates. Mrs. August Belmont paid a tribute to the business men who had contributed so liberally to the Red Cross.

Total Casualties Announced Now 212,793; 253 Dead, 183 Wounded In Today's Lists

The War Department gave out two army casualty lists today, which contained 460 names, bringing the total for the army up to 207,268. No marine corps casualty list was issued, but the total previously reported for that arm of the service was 5,485. The total for both army and marine corps so far announced is now 212,793. The army lists issued today contained the names of 128 killed in action, 58 died of wounds, 7 died from accident and other causes, 1 died from airplane accident, 59 died of disease, 176 wounded severely, 2 wounded to a degree undetermined, 5 wounded slightly, and 24 missing in action.
