**WHO IS THE OLDEST WORKER FOR UNCLE SAM?—No. 10**



John E. Knight, seventy-one years old, living at 34 I street northwest, has given the Government fifty-three years of continuous service. He began his Government career as a messenger in the Bureau of Engraving and Printing in 1866 at an annual salary of \$600. Today Mr. Knight is a messenger in the War Department at a salary of \$720 per annum.

He was born on August 15, 1848, entering the Government service at the age of eighteen. In 1873 he was transferred from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing to the Government Printing Office, and was employed there until 1897. The Spanish-American war in '98 caused a sudden expansion of the War Department, to which he was transferred. He served as a messenger in the Department of War during the Spanish war and the present conflict, and says that he does not want to serve there during another war.

**SURE "BONE DRY" RIDER WILL STAY**

With the conferees on the revenue bill nearing an agreement, members of the conference committee say the "bone dry" amendment to the District, which was attached as a rider in the Senate, will be retained.

It has been practically settled for some time that this amendment would be accepted by the House conferees. "Dry" forces in the House have been assured of it for some weeks.

The "bone dry" amendment to the District, which extends the Reed "bone dry" law to the District of Columbia, will, as a matter of law, completely shut out bootleggers and others who bring in liquor from Baltimore and nearby places. However, it will not make it certain that there will be no evasions.

The only question which is left as a matter of practical importance with respect to the "bone dry" amendment is whether the revenue bill itself is enacted before this session ends. The present indications are that it will be enacted and will be signed by the President in about a month.

**\$873,500 TO PAY FOR BLAST.**

Immediate appropriation of \$873,500 to pay 6,142 claims of persons in New Jersey for losses of private property resulting from the explosion at the T. A. Gillespie plant last October was asked of Congress yesterday by the War Department's special board investigating these claims. These claims were filed almost entirely by people of the poorest class, who lost their homes in the munition explosions.

**PARTED FROM WIFE HE ENDS OWN LIFE**

Despondency, caused by financial troubles and separation from his wife, is believed to have been responsible for the death of Albert Magruder Tubman, forty-five years old, who was found last night, dead in his bed, at 805 New Jersey avenue, with a bullet wound in his right temple, with a revolver by his side.

The body was discovered by James J. Handy, an occupant of the house, who telephoned for the ambulance from Casualty Hospital. Physicians, who answered the summons, say Tubman had been dead four or five hours.

Acting Coroner E. W. Titus issued a certificate of suicide.

Tubman had been employed at the National Hotel recently, the police said, but had been out of work for more than a week. About a year ago he was working at Camp Humphreys on construction jobs and later at Alexandria.

His brothers, Dr. J. R. Tubman, 1750 Park road, and Benjamin L. Tubman, 38 M street northwest, could say little as to his recent movements.
