COL. BISHOP, ACE, LECTURES TODAY

Col. William A. Bishop, the world's premier "ace," who put an end to the activities of over 100 German hospital bombers and other birdmen will lecture on his experiences in Flanders at 4:30 this afternoon, at the National Theater for the benefit of the Working Boys' Home of Washington.

Though not yet twenty-five years old, Colonel Bishop is conceded to be the world's greatest fighting birdman. He has seventy-two official German planes to his credit, and over thirty more victories which were not recognized because the official observer did not see them.

For his work in Flanders with the British army he has been decorated nine times.

Colonel Bishop went overseas in 1915, as a lieutenant of a Canadian cavalry. As this branch was too inactive in the war he transferred to the artillery, and was assigned as an observer. While taking a course in aerial observation in England, he learned to fly, and was transferred to the Canadian royal flying corps.

His first air victory was on March 25, 1917, and he soon became one of Britain's most noted air fighters. On his last flight, just before being recalled to England for less active service, he made the phenomenal record of downing five enemy planes in twenty minutes.

Would Give Soldiers Pay According to the Character of Service

A bill introduced yesterday by Congressman Little (Republican) of Kansas would grant gratuities to soldiers according to length and character of service.

Troops that had been under fire would receive twelve months' pay; combat troops abroad, but not under fire, six months' pay; combat troops at home and troops abroad, not liable to service under fire, four months' pay, and those at home, not liable to service under fire, one month's pay.

SAYS FOCH WEPT WHEN ARMISTICE WAS SIGNED

AURORA, Ill., Jan. 28.—"It was told and generally known in army circles that Marshal Foch wept when the armistice was signed. He had 500,000 Germans in a great trap which, was about to be sprung," said Col. Townsend Dodd, who went to France on General Pershing's staff, here while on a visit to his mother.

The colonel, who was chief of staff of the air forces of the third American army, was recently ordered home to make a report on American aerial activities and supplies at the front.

WILL LOSE BILLION IN BOOZE REVENUE

When Uncle Sam bids booze good-bye he loses a billion dollars a year in revenue.

But Sam has got it all fixed to get his billion, just the same. He's going to take it out of excess profits and big incomes.

He loses only half a billion this year, and that, he says, doesn't worry him any. The liquor taxes will come in up until July this year.

The reason the loss of the other \$500,000,000 is not considered serious at this time is that the sudden cutting of the war cut the needs for tax from \$5,000,000,000 to \$2,000,000,000. The loss of a mere half billion, therefore, was welcomed by revenue bill builders, who were finding it difficult to pare the measure within bounds.
