### WIFE ELOPES WITH SOLDIER-CHAUFFEUR

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Feb. 14.—George Crum, recently discharged from the army, emulated another warrior, one J. Caesar, in that he came, saw and conquered. But in the case of Crum, according to the police, it was the wife of his employer that was conquered.  
Crum was engaged as chauffeur for Edward Lee, wealthy Welleboro, Pa., lumber man, following his discharge. On February 1, the police allege, the soldier-chauffeur eloped with Lee's young wife, took the lumber man's seven-passenger automobile and his two-year-old child, besides two elder children of Mrs. Lee's by a former marriage.  
The trail of the runaway pair has been followed as far as this city through a series of checks alleged to have been forged both by Crum and Mrs. Lee. In addition to charges of forgery made by the police, Lee has brought charges of larceny against the pair and has offered a reward of \$500 for their apprehension.

### COLORED BOY HELD FOR SNATCHING POCKETBOOK

After a chase of several squares last night, Vaughn Pinkston, colored, fifteen years old, giving his address as 223 Massachusetts avenue northwest, was arrested and locked up charged with snatching a pocketbook from Miss Helen Haslinger, of 132 Todd place northeast.  
The youth is accused of snatching a pocketbook from Miss Haslinger at Fourteenth and G streets. Several gave chase and the fleeing boy ran into the arms of Policeman L. E. Bukright at Thirteenth and F streets northwest.

### URGES WORLD LOTTERY TO PAY DEBTS OF THE WAR

ROME, Feb. 14.—Former Premier Luzzatti yesterday forwarded to President Wilson a proposal for a world lottery, the proceeds of which would be devoted to paying the allies' war debts and aiding in reconstruction work.

Luzzatti believes of the 1,700,000,000 people in the world at least 500,000,000 would participate in the lottery. If they purchased an average of ten tickets each at \$20 a ticket, 5,000,000,000 would be raised, of which \$10,000,000 would be used for prizes.  
BAGLEY ORDERS CHANGED.  
Orders detailing Commander David Worth Bagley as naval attaché at the American embassy, The Hague, were countermanded yesterday by the Navy Department, and Commander Bagley was ordered to continue on duty as port officer at Rotterdam.

## REFERENDUM ON MERCHANT MARINE

Congress will face an expression of opinion from "the people back home," when recommendations for disposition of America's merchant fleet are put up to it by the United States Shipping Board.  
Shipping Board officials today believed that legislation, determining the future of the merchant marine, would be passed quickly when once laid before Congress.  
Chairman Hurley, in announcing that a referendum of commercial and civic opinion would be taken, pointed out that the questions involved were not national alone, but international.

Inasmuch as this nation will compete for the world's shipping control, the American people who built the fleet should decide how it should be run, Hurley contended. He spoke also of the great property value involved, saying it was practically twice as great as the railroads in this country and "Congress still has not decided what to do with the railroads."

## BOY FINDS MOTHER DEAD; RAZOR NEAR

FREDERICK, Md., Feb. 14.—The lifeless body of Mrs. Ida Maude Hansen, thirty-one years, was found yesterday afternoon in the apartments of the Maryland Inn by her twelve-year-old son, Leslie Hanson, on returning from school.  
The woman lay in a pool of blood which ran from a gaping wound in her neck. A razor lay on the floor beside her.  
The suicide, it is advanced by the husband, C. A. Hanson, proprietor of the All-American Garage, was the result of melancholy brought on by the news that Mrs. Hansen's mother, Mrs. James W. Brooks, Newport News, Va., was seriously ill.

## SENATORS URGE SIX MONTHS' PAY BONUS

A number of Senators have expressed themselves in favor of giving the discharged soldiers and sailors a bonus of six months' pay.  
The movement to this end has not yet taken any very definite form in Congress, but it is likely to do so in the new Congress.  
Senators Gronna, Borah and Kirby have declared in favor of it. Senator Kirby said it was "out-rageous" to increase the pay of men

in the departments who stayed home and then be economical in dealing with the soldiers.  
The revenue bill which has just been passed by both houses allows a bonus of \$50 to the officers and men upon discharge.

## ONIONS HELD UP; SEEK PRICE PLOT




