**YANKS INSURED
FOR 38 BILLIONS**

Uncle Sam has the biggest insurance business in the world—as much, in fact, as the rest of the world together. When the armistice was signed he had insured his soldiers for a total of between \$37,000,000,000 and \$38,000,000,000, fully two-thirds the cost of the war to the United States. This was written on the lives of 4,000,000 soldiers, 95 per cent of whom now carry insurance. The average policy is about \$8,750. The War Risk Insurance Bureau is now at work cancelling allotments to dependents of soldiers as they are discharged from the army. About 1,200,000 men made allotments. On December 9, 1918, the War Risk Insurance Bureau had made compensation awards on 4,023 death claims and 4,329 disability claims and had received a total of \$1,845 claims. A large number of the men insured are expected to keep their insurance in force. And the War Risk Insurance Bureau is expected to be in operation many years. If the death claims were paid in one sum, instead of by installments, they would amount to about \$800,000,000. Premiums to date amount to \$170,000,000, as an offset to these claims, or leaving a deficit of \$630,000,000. This figure may be greatly increased when final reports have been received. Deaths from influenza amounted to 17,000.

**\$240 RAISE TO BE
LAW THIS SESSION**

The \$240 increase in pay for Government employees for the fiscal year beginning July 1 will be law before the end of this session of Congress. All doubt on this question has been removed by the fact that both houses have agreed to the conference report on the legislative bill, which provides for the increase. The bill has gone to the President for his signature and it is expected he will sign it shortly. Not less important than the \$240 increase, and in some respects more important, is the provision in the bill for a joint commission to investigate salaries and report a plan for classifying and standardizing them. This is expected to result in legislation in the new Congress which will put Government salaries on a much better basis. At the same time, the investigation of postal service salaries by a commission provided for in the postoffice bill, is expected to eventually improve conditions in the postal service.

**CAUCUS TO PICK
SPEAKER TONIGHT**

Republican members of the next House of Representatives will meet

tonight to choose the party's candidate for the Speakership in the next Congress. While the formal election of a Speaker does not occur until the Sixty-sixth Congress convenes, the man chosen tonight will get the majority party support, and so will be practically certain of elevation to the Speaker's chair. The three Republican candidates

for the House's highest office are: Frederick Gillett of Massachusetts, James H. Mann of Illinois, and Phil Campbell of Kansas, who entered the race only Monday. LIQUOR SEIZURE ILLEGAL. TOLEDO, Ohio, Feb. 27.—Seizure of booze which passengers carried in motor cars into Michigan is illegal, according to United States District Attorney Lynch, who said the officers were operating on the Michigan side of the State line without authority and beyond their power.

FLOODS MENACE IN GEORGIA. ATLANTA, Ga., Feb. 27.—Heavy rains and consequent floods caused apprehension in Central and Western Georgia today. The Ocmulgee river at Macon was above flood stage, and a rise to twenty-one feet was expected. Flood warnings were issued. Torrential rains south of Macon threatened up railroad traffic.
