

Total Casualties Announced Now 280,166; 67 Dead In Today's List

The War Department gave out one army casualty list today which contained 67 names, bringing the total for the army up to 273,741. No marine corps list was issued, but the total previously reported for that arm of the service was 6,078. The total for both army and marine corps so far announced is now 280,166.

The army list issued today contained the names of 1 died from wounds, 11 died from accident and other causes, and 55 died of disease.

GIRL HAS EAGLE EYE FOR BANDITS

NEW YORK, April 6.—The desire of Miss Gustie Olson, of Minneapolis, Minn., to see New York city has been gratified at last. For years the pretty young woman has read about the city and listened to wondrous tales of it carried home by her friends who had the good fortune to come here.

Although Miss Olson's visit to the city is at the expense of Minneapolis, she is not a winner of a popularity contest. It is due simply to her daring and ability to describe persons.

Several weeks ago the Liberty State Bank, in Minneapolis, where Miss Olson is employed, was the scene of a bold hold-up in which armed robbers made off with a large haul of money and valuable securities. Menacing with revolver the employees, the robbers threatened to shoot any one in the bank who raised a head. Miss Olson glanced at the intruders, and when they left she furnished a description of them.

Three arrests were made in this city. The prisoners, known as "Ice Wagon" Connors, "Jaw Charley" Berger and "Mike" McAfferty, through their counsel, William J. Fallon, obtained a writ of habeas corpus to fight extradition to Minneapolis. Justice Cochran, in the supreme court, is soon to give a decision.

Miss Olson is in the city as a witness for the Minneapolis authorities, and on her testimony and expected identification the prisoners may return to that city to face trial. In the meantime Miss Olson is seeing everything there is to see in New York and having the time of her life.
