

PASTORS DENOUNCE BOLSHEVIST WAVE

Bolshevism received nothing but denunciation at the hands of the Rev. Dr. James L. Gordon, of the First Congregational Church, yesterday in his sermon on "Bolshevism, Deba, and 1920."

"Bolshevism is an inconsistent mixture of four things, said Dr. Gordon, popular ignorance, national conceit, low-brow bassness, and long haired idealism. Bolshevism is communism without four things—character, conscience, chastity, or Christ. Bolshevism is anti-home, anti-marriage, anti-property, anti-morality, anti-Christianity, and anti-Chris. It is a huge false thought wave that is sweeping across the world."

"Deba attempted to create a false thought wave in the United States. He was tried before a jury and was convicted and sentenced. He ought to be in jail."

There is one way to safeguard America from bolshevism, according to Dr. Gordon. He said that every man, even the poorest, should own a home, and that in case he is too poor to buy one, the Government should lend him the money to get one.

In speaking on bolshevism at the Eighth Street Temple, Dr. William C. Huntington, American commercial attaché at Petrograd, said that bolshevism is merely the setting up of anarchy against law and order and could be likened to the setting up of German Kultur against the world.

Any proposal by the American delegation at the Paris peace conference to recognize the Russian bolshevik government was denounced as "a policy of weakness and dishonor," by the Rev. Dr. Randolph in his sermon on "America's Duty in the Face of the International Peril of Bolshevism."

The speaker condemned the proposed parity with the bolshevik leaders at Prinkipoo islands as "policy of compromise with the enemies of civilization," and advocated the raising of a volunteer army of 200,000 to go to Russia in "to holy crusade to destroy the deadliest nest of vipers the world has ever seen." He declared that the policy pursued by the allies in inviting the bolshevik leaders to a conference had served to strengthen the prestige of bolshevism and had given Lenin the idea that the allies were afraid of the movement.

NEW YORK, April 7.—John Armstrong Chaloner, author of the famous query, "Who's looney now?", says some things are cheaper in New York than they were twenty-two years ago when he escaped from the ploomington asylum.

Chaloner, who is now a resident of Virginia, and a lawyer, is safe from the asylum authorities on a special grant of immunity while here to testify in a trial which involves his estate of several millions.

His "Who's looney now?" telegram was sent to his brother, Robert Chaloner, on the occasion of Robert's marriage to Lina Cavalieri. He changed his name from Chaloner to Chaloner because of a family quarrel.
