# War Is Over War Isn't Over

Leave It To The Supreme Court To Find Out About This Thing.

**TIS AND TIS'NT.**

The war was legally ended when President Wilson, in communicating the terms of the armistice to a joint session of Congress on November 11, 1918, remarked: "The war thus comes to an end."

FEDERAL JUDGE E. E. CUSHMAN, AT SAN FRANCISCO, CALIF., APRIL 4.

The war is not over until the president notifies the people by proclamation.

Knotty legal problems, bearing directly or indirectly on both wartime and constitutional prohibition, were today threatening to clutter the docket of the United States Supreme Court. Pending anticipated appeals to the country's final tribunal from conflicting decisions like the above, the State of Rhode Island is reported about to make a test case before the Supreme Court of the constitutionality of national prohibition.

According to a well-defined report current in the Supreme Court room, distinguished counsel, acting in the name of Rhode Island, will soon file briefs there in which the legality of the constitutional prohibition amendment is to be attacked on various grounds, including the right of several State legislatures to ratify the amendment because of its existence in those States of a referendum.

Prohibition leaders here declared they were already prepared to meet the latter contention with one caveat, inasmuch as Rhode Island, whose legislature refused to ratify the amendment, is without a referendum, she is not entitled to meddle with the affairs of those States that possess one.

**Could Expedite Case.**  
However soon Rhode Island, whose proposed action is described here as having been authorized by her legislature, may seek to have her test case placed on the Supreme Court docket, it cannot, under the rules of procedure of that tribunal, be called up until the next term, which starts in October next. The court could, however, then expedite the case, and "wets" here who are apparently seeking some ray of hope from Rhode Island's move, expressed the belief that there wouldn't be much difficulty in having a final decision handed down before constitutional prohibition is scheduled to go into effect on January 18, 1920.

While constitutional prohibition is looming up in the Supreme Court, the question of whether war-time prohibition is or is not to become effective on July 1, 1919, is one that was becoming today more and more a subject for heated argument between "wets" and "drys." It was not regarded as all unlikely that the Supreme Court might eventually decide when the war did legally end, but hardly before the next term of court, if such a decision is expected as a result of the opposing views of Federal Judge Evans and Federal Judge Cushman, by which time, July 1, 1919, would have passed into history.

The White House is certain to be watched closely, upon the President's return, by both prohibitionists and anti-prohibitionists, for with him will rest the power to revoke or not revoke the order for wartime prohibition. "Wets" admitted they were not pinning too much hope on a revocation of the order; "drys" predicted that it would not be revoked.

**Probably Got It Straight.**  
In the meanwhile official Washington was still discussing today a circumstantial story from Pennsylvania, the home State of Attorney General A. Mitchell Palmer, that a prominent Democrat who ran on the Democratic ticket in that State at last year's election, upon returning to Allentown from Washington, had offered to wager \$1,000 to \$500 that the war-time prohibition order would be revoked by June 1.

"The 'wet' prophet is close enough to at least one Cabinet officer to have received a straight tip as to Administration plans," ran this story. "To be or not to be," seems to sum up the prohibition situation, which at present is again running at a high fever pitch in official and unofficial circles of the nation's "bone-dry" Capital.

# FLYER'S LIFE SAVED BY CARRIER PIGEON

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., April 7.—If a bird can be a hero, then a blue carrier pigeon is the hero of this story.

Ensign Finch, a navy airman, was adrift in a flying boat without fuel late Saturday night, and the sea was rough.

At the same hour William Lyall, of Toronto, was seated in his room at a hotel when an exhausted carrier pigeon fluttered in through the open window.

Lyall's visitors, Judge Joseph Burdington, of the United States Circuit Court of Appeals for Pennsylvania, and Lieut. Matthew Taylor, late commander of land forces from Cape Hatteras to Florida, found a small cylinder of aluminum on the bird's leg. Within the cylinder was a piece of paper about the size of a special delivery stamp. It bore this message:

"Down ten miles west of submarine chaser at 4:15 p. m. No. 22."

A message was immediately flashed to Cape May, and the design was rescued by a day morning.

Naval officers are seeing to it today that the carrier pigeon receives the best care possible.

**TUNNEL FOR JAP ISLANDS.**  
Japan's after-the-war building program includes the construction of a railway tunnel under the Shimono-eki strait. The tunnel will connect the islands of Hono and Kishuu. It will be three and one-half miles long, and will cost approximately \$9,970,000. The period of construction is expected to be ten years.


