**YEOMEN (F) MAKE
HIT AT PARADE**

Commended by the Acting Secretary of the Navy the battalion of yeomen (F) of the District yesterday afternoon-paraded and, was inspected on the White Lot.

After the review and inspection the Secretary praised the work of the young women, saying the organization had done much to prosecute the war by promoting interest in the work of the department.

Chief Yeoman (F) Loretta McBride presented the Acting Secretary with a large American flag on behalf of the battalion. Miss McBride is leaving the battalion to take up work with the Knights of Columbus in France.

The battalion, which is commanded by Ensign J. P. O'Neil, gave a ball to its officers last night at Rauscher's. The event was also a farewell to Miss McBride.

**VILLA FIGHTS WITH
TROOPS IN PARRAL**

JUAREZ, Mex., April 25.—Francisco Villa, at the head of 3,500 troops, is believed to be engaged in battle with federal troops for the possession of Parral today.

American mining men who arrived here last night from Parral say Villa entered the city Sunday morning, following a skirmish with the small garrison stationed there. Government troops are reported to have left Chihuahua city Tuesday to retake the city.

The Americans report that Villa ordered the execution Tuesday of Jose de la Luz Herrera, former mayor of Parral, and his two sons.

Villa is reported to have made demands for heavy tributes from American and foreign mining concerns for the protection of their properties from damage at the hands of his followers.

**LINEN SHOWER TODAY
FOR SIBLEY HOSPITAL**

The annual Easter tea and linen shower for the benefit of the Sibley Memorial Hospital will be given this afternoon from 3 to 10 at 1180 North Capitol street. Miss Dick Root has charge of the arrangement of the program. Mrs. Newton Baker, wife of the Secretary of War, will sing. The Philharmonic Trio—Miss Ruth Jones, Miss Ruby Stanford and Mrs. Helen Affleck—will render several groups. A. C. Eldridge, organist of St. Margaret's Church, will play.

Sibley Memorial Hospital receives no Government appropriation, and is in need of public contributions for necessary laundry equipment. Some of the items from last year's report are: Thirty-five hundred patients admitted to Sibley; 1,800 operations performed; 802 babies born in Sibley; 1,200 cases treated in the dispensary; \$4,800 used in free work.

**POLAND REPLACING PAPER
UNDERCLOTHES WITH CLOTH**

POSEN, April 25.—Paper underclothing is slowly disappearing and the genuine article appearing in the shops in Polish cities and towns. Leather is also returning to replace the combination of paper and leather footwear.

The American Red Cross Commission is making a survey of Posen, assisting the health authorities to organize campaigns against typhus which was introduced by prisoners returning from Russia. Infected men are immediately quarantined and prompt steps taken to prevent the spread of the disease.

Drugs and fats are the greatest needs of the district. Generally the people are not suffering to the same extent from famine and disease as in other parts of Poland.

**PARCEL POST MAY BE
SENT TO LUXEMBOURG**

Commencing at once parcel post packages for Luxembourg, ordinary and registered, will be accepted at the postage rate of 12 cents a pound or fraction thereof for packages up to eleven pounds in weight, the Post-office Department ordered today.

They will be dispatched from New York to destination by such steamship facilities, via Belgium, as are available.

A surtax to cover the special cost of delivery in Luxembourg will be charged the addressees at the time of delivery.

FRANCE HAS EIGHT-HOUR LAW.

PARIS, April 25.—The French Senate has passed the eight-hour labor bill, which now becomes a law.
