

POINTS OUT DANGER IN GOVT. OWNERSHIP

MONTREAL, May 9.—President E. W. Beatty, K. C., in an address to the shareholders at the annual meeting of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company today, stated that the results of the year's operation were, on the whole, satisfactory, notwithstanding the shrinkage in net earnings, due to the extraordinary increase in wage scales and cost of materials.

"Over 77 per cent of the total increase in operating expenses," he said, "was due to the increase in wages. The increase in gross earnings was due to the advance in rates granted in March and July."

"After four years of war the physical condition of the property was excellent, requiring only usual maintenance expenditures to insure usual efficiency."

"The financial showing of the last three months of the fiscal year has been disappointing, but not unexpectedly so. The financial position of the company at the end of the fiscal year was, on the whole, extremely gratifying."

Many Blunders Made.

"Serious and continuing blunders in railway policy have resulted in the government being required to assume the ownership of 11,400 odd miles of railway, with the prospect of an additional 6,400 miles. When this acquisition has been accomplished, the principal competing systems in Canada will be the Canadian Pacific and the Canadian national railways."

"I have no fear of government ownership, but I do have a fear of private competition under equal conditions. It has recently been found necessary to give the national railways special privileges in the matter of construction of railways not enjoyed by private companies and to exempt them from complying in other respects with the existing laws respecting railways. I sincerely trust that this policy of making one law for the national railways and one for private enterprises will neither be continued nor extended because nothing would, in my opinion, be calculated to destroy confidence in Canadian railway enterprise more than a policy which confers exclusive and peculiar rights on the national railways designed to make the competitive conditions unequal."

Must Bar Politics.

"The subject of government ownership has received much attention recently, but not nearly as much as the importance of the subject justifies notwithstanding our previous experience and that of the United States and Great Britain. If government ownership and operation of railways is to be attempted on a large scale the situation is full of danger which cannot be avoided or even minimized except by rigorous independent and non-political administration, which is at least difficult to establish under our system of government. This fact, however, can only be obvious; that in no other way can the people of Canada obtain a correct appreciation of the results of government operation of the systems which are or which may hereafter come into its possession than by their being only realized if administered in strict accordance with the laws of the country under which other companies have to operate, and by their financial and accounting methods being audited as accurately and as accurately as the law now requires as private corporations and by the exact financial results being submitted to Parliament each year."

"It would seem to be obviously wise that the assumption of further obligation should be at least deferred until the practicality of government administration or operation under the aegis of the government (which is quite inseparable from government ownership) has been demonstrated."

JUGO-SLAVS PROTEST TO WILSON.

SAN DIEGO, Cal., May 9.—Jugo-Slav residents of this city have cabled to President Wilson protesting against the allotment of the Island of Vie to Italy. They declare natives of the island are 100 per cent Jugo-Slavic. Resolutions of the same tenor were adopted by Jugo-Slavs at a mass meeting in Los Angeles. The message is signed by Paul Petrich, representative of the Jugo-Slav national council.


