ATTEMPT MADE TO KILL PADEREWSKI

WARSAW, May 14.—A bolshevik attempt to assassinate Premier Paderewski was made here when he returned to Warsaw from Paris, says a copyright dispatch to the New York Herald.

Premier Paderewski's return from the peace conference was the occasion for a mammoth demonstration in his honor, and when he and Mme. Paderewski stepped from their car at the Vienna station thousands of Poles were there to welcome him.

As the premier and Mme. Paderewski emerged from the railway station and were about to enter their automobile, two men standing near them suddenly shouted in unison: "Down with Paderewski!"

At the same moment they drew revolvers, and at close range tried to shoot the premier. Before they could level their weapons, however, a score of men pounced on them, beat them to the ground and disarmed them.

Before the gendarmes could rescue the two, the crowd, realizing what had happened, fought their way to them and beat them unmercifully. One of the men is a young Jew named Isaac Hablum. The other is well known locally as a bolshevik and is a Pole.

BOLSHEVIK BOAT IS SUNK BY BRITISH

ARCHANGEL, May 14.—One Bolsheviki gunboat is reported to have been sunk on the Dvina river Sunday during an engagement between the British river flotilla and land batteries and the enemy fleet.

The allied flotilla, aided by airplanes, also conducted a brisk bombardment along the Vaga river.

LONDON (via Montreal), May 14.—The Bolsheviki artillery is active on the front in northern Russia, but is being silenced by the allied counter-fire when it becomes too active, a dispatch to the British war office from Archangel says.

The Dvina river is free of ice and river transport is in full swing. The White sea is not yet clear of ice, but is navigable without difficulty at the mouth.

STOCKHOLM, May 14.—The arrival here of General Skoropadski, former hetman of the Ukraine, is reported by the newspapers. General Skoropadski is on his way to Helsinki, Finland, where it is understood he will take part in a conference over measures to be taken against the Russian Bolsheviki.

BRITAIN TO PAY \$35,500,000 TO U. S. FOR WAR GOODS

Official of the War Department explained yesterday that the agreement reached between the United States Liquidating Commission and representatives of the British government whereby Great Britain will pay to the United States \$35,500,000 as a final settlement had to do only with outstanding claims each government had against the other in the production of war materials in the United States and abroad.


The agreement does not take into consideration the accrued obligations of the United States for the transportation of troops and supplies in British bottoms, nor does it include various other cooperative efforts. Separate settlements are to be reached on each of these questions.
